182 Headingley Cricket Ground

Further to Minute 177 of the meeting held on 14th December 2005 the Director of Corporate Services submitted a report providing an update to Members on progress of discussions in relation to a request from the Yorkshire County Cricket Club Ltd for the Council to provide assistance to enable them to purchase the Headingley Cricket Ground in order to secure test matches at the ground.

A copy of a proposed agreement between Yorkshire County Cricket Club and the Leeds Cricket Football and Athletics Co Ltd was appended to the report.

Circulated at the meeting were details of transaction costs, a plan of the areas under discussion and an updated appendix A.
