RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY - That this Council welcomes the continued progress of the Climate Change and Sustainable Energy Bill in the House of Commons, whilst noting the productive use of microgenerated energy by local authorities across the country.

It therefore calls upon the Executive Board to consider a report looking at ways of using the government's Low Carbon Building funding, in conjunction with other financial means to produce microgenerated energy in Leeds City Council and ALMO properties across the city.

With the consent of the seconder and of Council, Councillor Blake altered her motion to incorporate the ammendment and upon being put to the vote it was:

This Council resolves to do everything possible to preserve and protect green field, PAS and green belt sites from development and welcomes the Leeds Development Plan Panel's recommendation calling on officers to bring forward appropriate strategy to achieve this protection of our valuable green areas.
