### **Project Summary**

Providing modern dance / break dance instruction for young children and teenagers, male and female in the Outer West area. This project has run successfully over the last 2 year and popularity has grown due to word of mouth.

Lessons have been held weekly on a Wednesday, classes for age 5 to 10 start at 4.45 pm and end at 5.45 pm. classes for age 10 - 16 start at 5.45 pm and end at 6.45 pm. Classes are to run from 1st April 2016 to 31st March 2017. Due to the different age groups attending the sessions the under 8 session will now be half hourly. The older age group will continue to have full hour sessions.

## Targets for the project and how success will be measured

- The classes are aimed at young children and young adults and a register will be taken on each occasion.
- Feedback will be obtained from participants and their parents.
- Numbers will be monitored and if there is a decline further advertising will be carried out.

#### **Project Summary**

The aim of the project is to teach children from 5yrs old and over to swim. The project is open to children of all ethnic groups with varying capabilities, some being special needs. Funding will be used to help run the club including baths hire, insurance and any equipment that may be needed.

The group will hold 2 sessions a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:15-8:45. Funding is being sought for 10 weeks to support the group.

The group have been in existence since 1929 and have taught hundreds of children to swim including some of the local councillors. They have had a waiting list for a good number of years which includes children's names from birth onwards. There is no other private swimming club in the area teaching children to swim

The swimming club charges are £60 per quarter for each child.

#### Targets for the project and how success will be measured

The aim is to teach as many children, including those with special needs, to swim. The group has been formed since 1929 and have a high success rate.

#### How the project will be promoted and/or participation encouraged

- By continuing to run the swimming club and holding a thriving waiting list
- Parents are regularly enquiring about when their child can join their club

#### Exit strategy/How the project will continue after the funding

The group has been running since 1929 and will continue as long as it is financially feasible
