The below information provides a list of primary schools that have been selected based on a range of deprivation and pupil outcome indices (informed by Fisher Family Trust, Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index and the Department of Education). Case studies for a subset of these schools have been created to support Scrutiny in their identification of schools to be visited during autumn term 2017. This subset allows for a range of contextual deprivation and other pertinent criteria to be considered.

Locality and IMD

Seacroft Manston. Top quintile for highest levels of pupils living in the 10% most deprived areas nationally.

Context

Top quintile for highest levels of FSM eligibility. Relatively stable (bottom 60% in year moves -and high proportions of white UK, 6% EAL.

Stable leadership, Outstanding Ofsted March 2015, part of local trust (LEPP)

Strong leadership, HT brokered by LA for support school to school.

Two form entry with Nursery

Link with Trinity and All Saints in Pathways ITT training

Outcomes for 2016

Combined RWM 55% and similar in 2017.

RWM FSME: 47.4% Non FSME: 60%

The gap was 12.6% (compared to LA gap 26.3%)

Blenheim Primary School

Locality and IMD

Inner northwest. Top quintile for highest levels of pupils living in the 10% most deprived areas nationally.

Context

91% BME, 72% EAL, 10% SEND.

25% FSM, high mobility

Stable leadership, Good Ofsted June 2015, part of Lantern Learning Trust.

Part of EEF project (IPEELL)

Have recently expended to two form entry with Nursery

Outcomes for 2016

Combined RWM 53% and 61% in 2017

RWM FSME: 25% Non FSME: 42.9% Gap 17.9%

Corpus Christi Catholic Corpus Primary School

Locality and IMD

Templenewsam Halton. Top quintile for highest levels of pupils living in the 10% most deprived areas nationally.

Context

Bottom 60% for in year moves (lowest quintile)

53% white UK, 47% other. 23% EAL and 23% SEN

Stable leadership, Good Ofsted September 2014, with O/S for behaviour.

1.5 FTE (45 children per year group)

Active member of Catholic partnership, very close links with Corpus Christi Catholic College

Combined RWM 79% and 86% in 2017

Gap 29.7% (compared LA 26.3%)

Harehills Primary School

Locality and IMD

CHESS. Top quintile for highest levels of pupils living in the 10% most deprived areas nationally.

Context

Over 80% BME (96%), EAL 84%

Stable staffing and leadership, Good Ofsted December 2015, with outstanding for L and M and personal development, behaviour and welfare.

Strong family support team, good links children centre.

3 form entry with Nursery

Part of EEF project (Dialogic talk) and Arooj

Outcomes for 2016

Combined RWM 49%, strong progress measures. Rising trends in other key stages

RWM FSME: 35.3% Non FSME: 52.3%

Gap 17% (LA 26.3%)

Parklands Primary School

Locality and IMD

Seacroft Manston. Top quintile for highest levels of pupils living in the 10% most deprived areas nationally. In addition over 90% of pupils in the bottom 20% IMD

Context

Top quintile for highest level of pupils with FSM eligibility with over 45% FSM6, 29% SEND

7% White British, 13% EAL

Relatively new HT, who has significantly raised profile of school (TES winner 2017) expecting Ofsted (last Good 2012)

Resourced provision (Complex needs)

Two form entry with Nursery

School takes a number of pupils from Women's refuge adjacent to school

Good Ofsted June 2015, part of Lantern Learning Trust, relatively new HT.

Part of EEF project (IPEELL)

Combined RWM 43% and 48% in 2017

RWM FSME: 36.4% Non FSME 47.1%

St Augustine's Catholic Primary School

Locality and IMD

Inner East. Over 80% of pupils live in the 10% most deprived areas nationally and 90% in 20% most deprived.

Context

FSM lower at 17.5%

77% BME, 43% EAL, 10% SEN

Stable and strong leadership, Good Ofsted October 2013

Two from entry with Nursery

Outcomes for 2016

Combined RWM 52% and 58% in 2017

RWM FSME: 70% Non FSME: 47.6%

Gap -22.4% (LA 26.3%)

Westwood Primary School

Locality and IMD

Beeston, Cottingly and Middleton. Top quintile for highest levels of pupils living in the 10% most deprived areas nationally.

Context

Top quintile for highest levels of FSM eligibility. Relatively stable (bottom 60% in year moves -and high proportions of white UK, 88% White British and 6% EAL.

20% SEND

Stable leadership, hard federation.

Good Ofsted October 2014

Outcomes for 2016

Combined RWM 53% and 61% in 2017

RWM FSME: 38.5% Non FSME: 57.7%

Gap 19.2% (LA 26.3%)

Windmill (The Music Federation)

JESS (Inner south Leeds). Top quintile for highest free school meal eligibility

Context

Over 90% of pupils in bottom 20% IMD, over 25% SEND

Hard federation (music) with Low Road, stable leadership

Ofsted Good in October 2014

5-11 provision, two form entry

RWM FSME: 36.4% NON FSME: 37%

Gap 0.6% (LA 26.3%)
