The following is an example of how the 2009/10 Well-Being Fund could be earmarked against the Area Delivery Plan (ADP) priority themes to enable activities to be commissioned.

Members are requested to note that this is intended only as a guide.

At the time of writing this report the final close down of accounts for 08/09 has not taken place. As a result the final figure of unspent funds from the 08/09 budget available to spend in 09/10, together with the final figure for projects already committed from the 09/10 allocation are subject to revision. These will be presented to the Area Committee in June 2009. Members are requested to bear this in mind, particularly in relation to the balance of ring-fenced funds.

The table below takes into account funding for projects already committed from the 09/10 allocation and ring-fenced projects such as skips and NIPs which have been topped up to the original budget figure.
