This is an application for a premises licence which wishes to provide the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises. The premises' proposal is to trade as a retail grocery shop.

Please see point 3.3.2 for proposed timings of operation.

The responsible authorities are served with copies of the application by the applicant and Ward Members have been notified of the application.

1 Purpose of this report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 The Committee is required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2 History of the Premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence for these premises.

3 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Mr Omer Kondu,

5 Matters relevant to the application

- 5.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make decisions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm
- 5.2 In the making of their decision Members are obliged to have regard to the national guidance and the council's licensing policy. Members will be aware they must also have regard to the relevant representations made and evidence they hear.

6 Options available to members

- 6.1 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - · Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 6.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.







I write to object to the application for this shop to be converted into an Off Licence. Granting a licence to sell alcohol until the early hours of the morning in a residential district will enlarge the problem associated with food and drink premises that already blights this part of central Headingley.

The residents of Headingley suffer from very high levels of anti-social behaviour associated with alcohol and related activities, such as fast food outlets. This development stands to worsen the situation by increasing the loss of amenity for residents – the right to a peaceful existence. Granting a premises licence for this shop will considerably increase the hours during which local people feel intimidated on their own streets and are repeatedly woken by loud groups of young people moving from outlet to outlet.



NEW PREMISES LICENCE - LICENSING ACT 2003: POLICE - LETTER OF REPRESENTATION - 'QUALIFIED' OBJECTION:

Thank you for submitting your application for the above premises, received at the address above on 12th April 2011.

I have commissioned our Divisional Intelligence Analyst to compile a report of crime and anti-social behaviour in the half mile area surrounding North Lane in Headingley (using the former Lounge Cinema as a reference) which is attached.

It clearly shows a high number of anti-social behaviour incidents in the last 6 months – 338 in total, of these, 219 (65%) are rowdy inconsiderate behaviour, the peak times for which are between 21:00 and 02:00hrs. There were also 33 violent offences in the same area during the same 6 month period to 30th April 2011, 18 of these offences involved alcohol. The peak times for these offences was between 22:00 and 02:00.

The above shows a link between crime / anti social behaviour late at night in the very close vicinity of the proposed new off licence premises.

Taking the above information into consideration, WYP feel that to grant the application in the terms sought would undermine the crime prevention objective and add to existing problems experienced in the Headingley area. These problems are well documented and acknowledged, resulting in the recent expansion of the Cumulative Impact Policy in the Headingley area. Whist I accept that this type of

premises does not fall into the categories covered by the CIP, the reasons behind implementing the revised CIP cannot be ignored either.

After having discovered by chance that the applicant also wishes to operate a late night delivery service of alcohol from the premises, this has made my assessment of the application a lot more difficult, and has resulted in specific conditions relating to this aspect of the licence being asked for.

For these reasons, WYP wish to object to the times applied for, and would only be satisfied with the sale by retail of alcohol terminating at 23:00 every day, the premises closing to the public at 23:00 every day, with off sales for the alcohol delivery service permitted to 00:00 every day.

We therefore confirm that we are submitting a formal representation against your application on the grounds of-:

- 1. the prevention of crime & disorder
- 2. the protection of children from harm.

However, West Yorkshire Police are also of the opinion that the said objectives could be met should you be prepared to incorporate certain identified measures within your operating schedule, in <u>addition</u> to what you may have offered in your application.

Please find enclosed a document which at **Part 1** contains the suggested measures which this authority considers are proportionate and appropriate to the nature of your application.

Should you be in agreement with the suggested measures then please signify this by completing and signing Part 2 of the enclosed form and return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

Upon receipt of your consent at Part 2, it will be taken that you signify your wishes for the licensing authority to amend your operating schedule to incorporate the proposed measures.

Alternatively should you disagree with the proposed measures, then please complete Part 3 and again return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

PART 1 - to be completed by the Responsible Authority:

West Yorkshire Police propose the following control measures under the Licensing Act 2003 (in addition to those that you may have already offered), for the premises-:

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, West Yorkshire Police considers that the following measures are relevant, proportionate and necessary in order to promote the following licensing objectives:

- the prevention of crime & disorder
- · the protection of children from harm

Measures proposed to replace those described in Part P of the application:

- A suitable CCTV system will be operational on the premises at all times when licensed activities are being carried out
- The system will conform with current West Yorkshire Police guidelines (West Yorkshire Police November 2010) in respect of business related CCTV equipment. It will be adequately maintained and be capable of transporting recorded material onto removable media
- CCTV security footage will be made secure and retained for a minimum period of 31 days time to the satisfaction of WYP
- At all times that licensable activities are taking place there will be a member of staff on duty
 who is conversant with operating the CCTV system and who is able to download immediately
 any footage requested by an officer from any of the Responsible Authorities or the Licensing
 Authority
- The PLH/DPS staff will ask for proof of age from any person appearing to be under the age of 21 who attempts to purchase alcohol at the premises
- Notices indicating the existence and effect of an Alcohol Designated Public Places Order will be prominently displayed at the exits to the premises
- The PLH/DPS will belong to a recognised trade body or Pub Watch Scheme where one exists, whose aims include the promotion of the licensing objectives

Measures relating to the alcohol delivery service:

COMPUTER ADVERTISING:

Any computer website advertising this alcohol delivery service shall AT ALL TIMES clearly indicate-;

- a. The name of the delivery service, valid telephone numbers, e-mail address, the premises licence number which authorises the sale/supply of alcohol and the relevant licensing authority which issued the premises licence;
- b. The ordering by, sale/supply of any alcohol product to anybody under the age of 18, or delivery of any alcohol products to anybody under the age of 18 is strictly forbidden;
- c. Every person placing an order, MUST provide a date of birth otherwise the order will be REFUSED OUTRIGHT at the time of order;
- d. On delivery where required to do so, there will be a check 21 policy in place and refusal to provide only valid & accredited proof of age cards/documents, will result in the delivery of any alcohol order being REFUSED OUTRIGHT.

ORDERS FOR ALCOHOL PRODUCTS:

On EVERY occasion an order for any alcohol product is processed under the terms of this premises licence, either on-line or by any other means, then an invoice will be produced;

Every invoice MUST at the very least contain the following information -:

- a. personal details of the person / company placing the order which MUST include the name, telephone number of the person / company placing the order, and the full postal address to which the order will be delivered,
- b. confirmation that the person placing the order has provided a date of birth proving they are over 18,
- c. the quantity, description and price of the alcohol products ordered,
- d. the date and time that the order took place,
- e. how the invoice total is to be paid for, by credit / debit card with the order or by payment (including cash) on delivery,
- f. the date and time that the ordered goods will be selected and packaged for delivery at the 'licensed premises',
- g. the date and time it is expected that the order will be dispatched from the 'licensed premises' to the address given at (a),
- h. where an order is refused, the full details for the refusal.
- A copy of all invoice orders shall AT ALL TIMES be retained at the company's registered office and/or the 'licensed premises' for possible inspection at anytime by a police constable or an authorised

officer of the licensing authority;

SALE / SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL PRODUCTS:

There will be no other premises used for the selection and packaging of alcoholic goods previously ordered and set aside for customer use but these 'licensed premises', and

Then only between the hours of 11:00 & 00:00 on any day and in any event.

DISPATCH / DELIVERY OF ALCOHOL PRODUCTS PREVIOUSLY ORDERED:

- Delivery of ANY alcohol products under the terms of this premises licence, shall ONLY take place where an order for those products has previously taken place, in a manner described previously;
- b. ALL alcohol products previously ordered, will ONLY be stored at the address identified on the premises licence as that of the 'licensed premises' and NO other premises;
- Delivery of ANY alcohol products previously ordered shall ONLY be dispatched from the address identified on the premises licence as that of the 'licensed premises' and NO other premises;
- d. NO members of the public will be allowed access to the 'licensed premises' between 23:00hrs and 00:00hrs;
- e. ALL deliveries from the 'licensed premises' will ONLY be made by the premises licence holder or other drivers employed by and then authorised to make deliveries by the premises licence holder:
- f. NO PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 18 will be employed by the premises licence holder as the driver of a vehicle to be involved in the operation of this business and to have any responsibility for the delivery of alcohol products from the 'licensed premises';
- g. NO OTHER ALCOHOL PRODUCTS shall be carried on ANY vehicle by ANY driver at ANY time, other than products previously ordered, properly invoiced and shown on a delivery note, dispatched from the 'licensed premises' and on the vehicle being delivered;
- h. NO FURTHER SALE / SUPPLY of ANY alcohol product (including ANY form of payment), shall take place on or from ANY vehicles at ANY time, either stationary or in transit, once ANY vehicle has commenced ANY journey from the 'licensed premises'; the sole purpose of which is to deliver ONLY those alcohol products previously ordered, properly invoiced and shown on a delivery note, despatched from the 'licensed premises' and on the vehicle for delivery;
- i. In addition, all drivers of vehicles involved in the delivery of alcohol products, will follow the following procedure when making delivery of an order previously made-:
 - 1. Carry a copy of all invoice orders in the form of delivery notes on the vehicle throughout the whole delivery;
 - The driver of the delivery vehicle, shall telephone or alert the purchaser by some other means when he arrives outside the address entered on the invoice / delivery note, but NOT by sounding the vehicle horn at ANY time;
 - 3. If the address on arrival is NOT the same as the one given at the time of ordering and invoiced, then the delivery will be REFUSED by the driver and the complete alcohol order, will be RETURNED to the 'licensed premises' from where it was dispatched by the driver;
 - 4. ALL drivers will make sure that the alcohol products are delivered to the person who made the order and who appears on the invoice / delivery note, otherwise the delivery will be refused and the order returned to the 'licensed premises' from where it was dispatched by the driver;
 - 5. Where any person accepting any delivery looks under 21, the driver will ask that person for only valid & accredited proof of age cards/documents recognised by West Yorkshire Police to prove they are over 18 to legally make the order / sale or accept the delivery;
 - 6. If valid & accredited proof of age cards/documents cannot be produced when requested or the driver is in any doubt after acceptable ID are produced, then the delivery will be refused and the order returned to the 'licensed premises' from where it was dispatched by the driver;
 - 7. No delivery of any alcohol products shall be left with anybody under 18 under any circumstances:

- 8. WHERE A DELIVERY IS REFUSED THE REASON MUST BE RECORDED ON THE INVOICE / DELIVERY NOTE:
- WHERE A DELIVERY IS REFUSED FOR ANY REASON THE COMPLETE ORDER/S MUST BE RETURNED TO THE LICENSED PREMISES BEFORE AGAIN BEING RE-ORDERED AT OR DELIVERED FROM THE 'LICENSED PREMISES';
- 10. The copy invoice / delivery note shall be kept on the vehicle until the delivery is complete, for possible inspection at any time by a police constable or an authorised officer of the licensing authority;
- 11. The copy invoice / delivery note shall be returned by the driver on completion of the delivery when it shall then be filed and retained alongside the original invoice at the company's registered office and/or the 'licensed premises', for possible inspection at any time by a police constable or an authorised officer of the licensing authority

No alcoholic products shall be dispatched from the licensed premises after 0000 on any day.

West Yorkshire Police are satisfied that the proposed measures are not adequately dealt with by other legislation.

By signing the declaration enclosed overleaf at Part 2, the applicant agrees to incorporate the proposed measures within the Operating Schedule for the said premises.

Upon the satisfactory completion of the declaration, West Yorkshire Police will provide notice to the Licensing Authority that our representation is withdrawn in accordance with schedule 10(a) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.


