- 1. This is an application for the grant of a premises licence for Nisa Local, 16 20 Fairleigh Road, Tingley, Wakefield, WF3 1PW.

1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2 Background Information

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence for these premises.

3 Main Issues

- 3.1 The applicant is Mr Mohammed Jamil,
- 3.2 The location of the premises can be found on the maps attached as Appendix A.
- 3.3 A copy of the application is attached as Appendix B to this report. For the assistance of members, the Operating Schedule shows:

3.3.1 Proposed licensable activities

Sale by retail of alcohol

3.3.2 Proposed hours of licensable activities

The proposed hours of licensable activities are as follows:

Sale by retail of alcohol

Every Day 07:00 - 22:00

3.3.3 Proposed times when the premises is open to the public

The premises propose to open to the public between the following hours

Everyday 07:00 - 22:00

3.3.4 Steps to promote the licensing objectives

The applicant proposes to take the steps identified in section "P" of the application form to promote the licensing objectives.

3.4 Proposed Designated Premises Supervisor

Mr Mohammed Jamil is nominated as the Designated Premises Supervisor.

3.5 Relevant Representations

- 3.5.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or interested parties. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of an interested party, must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 3.5.2 Any representations submitted may be agreed prior to a hearing. In this instance the operating schedule has been amended to include agreed measures with the following Responsible Authorities:

West Yorkshire Police - Members are invited to consider Appendix C of this report.

- 3.5.3 Representations opposing the application have been received from interested parties. Members are invited to consider Appendix D of this report.
- 3.5.4 Representations supporting the application have been received from interested parties. Members are invited to consider Appendix E of this report.
- 3.6 <u>Matters Relevant to the Application</u>
- 3.6.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make decisions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm
- 3.6.2 In the making of their decision Members are obliged to have regard to the national guidance and the council's licensing policy. Members will be aware they must also have regard to the relevant representations made and evidence they hear.

4 Corporate Considerations

- 4.1 Consultation and engagement
- 4.1.1 The application was subject to a 28 days consultation period in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003. Blue site notices were placed by the applicant on the premises and these were checked by Liaison and Enforcement Officers during the consultation period. The application was advertised in a newspaper circulating in the local area. Representations received during this 28 day consultation.
- 4.2 Equality and Diversity / Cohesion and Integration
- 4.2.1 The council has adopted a Statement of Licensing Policy which sets out the principles the council will use to exercise its functions under the Licensing Act 2003 and in which care has been taken in matters of equality, diversity and human rights. This policy is reviewed every three years. The council has completed equality, diversity, cohesion and integration screening and impact

assessments with regards to the consultation process undertaken during the review of the policy.

- 4.3 Council Policies and City Priorities
- 4.3.1 When determining an application the licensing sub committee must have regard for the Licensing Act 2003 Statement of Licensing Policy which sets out the principles the council will use to exercise its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Applicants are expected to read the policy before making their application and the council will refer to the policy when making its decisions.
- 4.3.2 The licensing regime contributes to the following aims:

By 2030, Leeds will be fair, open and welcoming

- Local people have the power to make decisions that affect them
- There is a culture of responsibility, respect for each other and the environment
- Our services meet the diverse needs of our changing population
- Everyone is proud to live and work

- 4.3.3 The licensing regime contributes to the following city priorities:

Best city... for communities:

- Reduce crime levels and their impact across Leeds
- Effectively tackle and reduce anti-social behaviour in communities
- 4.4 Resources and Value for Money
- 4.4.1 The licensing process, including the licensing sub committee, generates a cost to the council. The majority of these costs are covered by the application fee. The fees are set by Statute, and there is little option to increase the fee to cover all the cost. However, the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Bill, due to receive Royal assent in November 2011, may allow local authorities to set their own fees in the future based on full cost recovery.
- 4.5 Legal Implications, Access to Information and Call In
- 4.5.1 Applicants and people making representations are able to challenge the licensing sub-committee's decision by appealing to the Magistrates Court. Legal advice is provided during the sub committee hearing and during deliberations to mitigate the risk to the council.

- 4.6 Risk Management
- 4.6.1 Full training and legal advice is provided to members sitting on Licensing Sub Committee in order to mitigate the risk of legal challenge.

5 Conclusions

- An application has been received under the Licensing Act 2003 which is brought before a licensing sub committee for determination.
- The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.

The subject property is owned by Leeds City Council

We (Commercial Asset Management of Environment & Neighbourhoods Dept)) manage this property along with the other LCC owned shop properties throughout the city.

We would like to object to the proposal on the following grounds:

- The applicant is listed as being Nisa Stores. The property it relates to is held under a lease from Leeds City Council by Mr Mohammed Jamil , NOT Nisa Stores.
 - There have been recent incidents of Anti Social Behaviour in the area and we are concerned that if this store was to sell alcohol, alongside the existing Off Licence directly opposite, this could lead to further potential for trouble.
 - Mr Jamil's lease does NOT permit the sale of alcohol from the premises. He has been told on many occasions over the last few years whilst the shop was being refurbished, that we would not change his lease to accommodate the sale of alcohol. Granting him an alcohol licence would encourage him to breach this covenant which will lead to forfeiture of his lease. He has been warned about this
 - Fifty yards away opposite this shop is No 22 Fairleigh Road also owned by LCC which has operated as an Off Licence for many decades. The tenant Mr Bhagra also lives above the shop. We have a policy of not allowing competing shop uses in close vicinity to each other (i.e on the same parade / street) to prevent inevitable hardship befalling one or both of the tenants. This is why sale of alcohol is not permitted in the lease for 16 20 Fairleigh Road.






