# **Summary of main issues**

- 1. This is an application to vary a premises licence in respect of White Swan, Cross Hills, Kippax, Leeds, LS25 7JP
- 2. Responsible authorities have been served with copies of the application and Ward Members have been notified of the application.

# 1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

# 2 Background information

2.1 On the 27th July 2005 an application was received to convert and vary an existing premises licence. This application received representations from Environmental Health Services and West Yorkshire Police. The conditions which were offered by these authorities were agreed and placed on the Premises Licence and granted on the 19th February 2006.

An Application to transfer this licence to Enterprise Inns was received on the 2nd August 2010.

A further application to transfer this licence was received on the 18th April 2011 from Enterprise Inns to MIA Properties Leeds Limited.

A Minor Variation application was submitted on the 27th April 2011 which was for structural alterations to the inside of the premises only and therefore it was decided not to consult any of the relevant authorities. This minor variation application did not receive any public representations and as was therefore granted on the 15th May 2011.

On the 3rd August 2011 a variation application was received but due to errors made by the applicant it was sent back. This was resubmitted on the 12th August but pages were missing, these pages were received on the 16th August to complete this application.

2.2 A copy of the existing licence (including all conditions) is attached at Appendix A.

- 3.1 The applicant is MIA Properties Leeds Ltd,
- 3.2 The location of the premises can be found on the maps attached as Appendix B.

- 3.6 <u>Matters Relevant to the Application</u>
- 3.6.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make decisions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:
  - The prevention of crime and disorder
  - Public safety
  - The prevention of public nuisance
  - The protection of children from harm
- 3.6.2 In the making of their decision Members are obliged to have regard to the national guidance and the council's licensing policy. Members will be aware they must also have regard to the relevant representations made and evidence they hear.

# 4 Corporate Considerations

- 4.1 Consultation and engagement
- 4.1.1 The application was subject to a 28 days consultation period in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003. Blue site notices were placed by the applicant on the premises and these were checked by Liaison and Enforcement Officers during the consultation period. The application was advertised in a newspaper circulating in the local area. Representations received during this 28 day consultation.
- 4.2 Equality and Diversity / Cohesion and Integration
- 4.2.1 The council has adopted a Statement of Licensing Policy which sets out the principles the council will use to exercise its functions under the Licensing Act 2003 and in which care has been taken in matters of equality, diversity and human rights. This policy is reviewed every three years. The council has completed equality, diversity, cohesion and integration screening and impact assessments with regards to the consultation process undertaken during the review of the policy.

- 4.3 <u>Council Policies and City Priorities</u>
- 4.3.1 When determining an application the licensing sub committee must have regard for the Licensing Act 2003 Statement of Licensing Policy which sets out the principles the council will use to exercise its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Applicants are expected to read the policy before making their application and the council will refer to the policy when making its decisions.
- 4.3.2 The licensing regime contributes to the following aims:

- 4.3.3 The licensing regime contributes to the following city priorities:

- Reduce crime levels and their impact across Leeds
- Effectively tackle and reduce anti-social behaviour in communities
- 4.4 Resources and Value for Money
- 4.4.1 The licensing process, including the licensing sub committee, generates a cost to the council. The majority of these costs are covered by the application fee. The fees are set by Statute, and there is little option to increase the fee to cover all the cost. However, the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Bill, due to receive Royal assent in November 2011, may allow local authorities to set their own fees in the future based on full cost recovery.
- 4.5 Legal Implications, Access to Information and Call In
- 4.5.1 Applicants and people making representations are able to challenge the licensing sub-committee's decision by appealing to the Magistrates Court. Legal advice is provided during the sub committee hearing and during deliberations to mitigate the risk to the council.
- 4.6 Risk Management
- 4.6.1 Full training and legal advice is provided to members sitting on Licensing Sub Committee in order to mitigate the risk of legal challenge.

# 5 Conclusions

- 5.1 An application has been received under the Licensing Act 2003 which is brought before a licensing sub committee for determination.
- 5.2 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
  - Grant the variation application as requested.
  - Grant the variation application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
  - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
  - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 5.3 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.

# Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to quard against:
  - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
  - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
  - c. damage
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made
  - a. By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC,) Where the film has been classified by the Board, or
  - b. By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or,
  - c. where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20 (3) (b) (74 (3) (b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.
- 5. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

- a. games or activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
  - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- d. provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -

- i. the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- ii. the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- e. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 8. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 9. The responsible person shall ensure that
  - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
    - i. beer or cider. 1/2 pint;
    - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - iii. still wine in a glass:125 ml; and
  - b. customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

# Embedded restrictions attached to the licence by virtue of grandfather rights.

- 10. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours stated on this licence and:
  - a. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
  - b. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- 11. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
  - a. the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first thirty minutes after above hours;
  - b. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals.
  - c. consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol

to any person residing in the licensed premises;

- d. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
- e. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- f. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
- g. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- h. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- i. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- 12. Where the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 the licensee shall ensure that the provisions of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 are complied with.

#### Conditions consistent with the operating schedule relating to the licensing objectives

#### The prevention of crime and disorder

- 20. Adopt the Check 21 proof of age scheme in accordance with guidance issued by West Yorkshire Police.
- 21. Participate in a local pub watch scheme or licensing association (where one exists) that is recognised by West Yorkshire Police.
- 22. Where non standard timings are listed for any Bank Holiday period and there is no intention of the venue to utilise the additional hours during any part of that period, the venue to provide at least 10 days prior written notice to the Police.

23. When permission is sought for the sale or supply of alcohol during non-standard hours (excluding bank holidays listed within the application from), the applicant shall apply for a Temporary Event Notice, giving West Yorkshire Police at least 10 clear working days written notice.

#### **Public safety**

- 24. Written records of all accidents and safety incidents involving members of the public will be kept. These will be made available at the request of an authorised officer
- 25. Regular safety checks of the premises including decorative and functional fixtures, floor surfaces and equipment (including electrical appliances) to which the public may come in contact, must be undertaken. Records of these safety checks must be kept and made available for inspection by an authorised officer.
- 26. During opening hours the cellar door must be kept locked or adequately supervised to prevent unauthorised access by the public
- 27. Electrical installations will be inspected on a periodic basis ( at least every 3 years or at a frequency specified in writing) by a suitably qualified and competent person. Inspection records/certificates will be kept. These will be made available at the request of an authorised officer
- 28. If used, any temporary electrical wiring and distributions will be inspected by a suitably qualified and competent person before they are put into use. An inspection record/certificate will be retained for inspection by an authorised officer
- 29. Safety glass that is impact resistant or shielded to protect it from impact will be used in all areas where the public may come into contact with it
- 30. All floor surfaces will be suitably slip resistant, kept in good condition and free of obstructions to prevent slips, trips or falls
- 31. Members of the public will be prevented from accessing hot food and drink preparation areas to prevent risk of scalds or burns to them
- 32. A suitably trained First Aider or appointed person will be provided at all times when the premises are open
- 33. Adequate and appropriate First Aid equipment and materials will be available on the premises
- 34. A procedure for dealing with unwell members of the public will be in place including those who appear to be affected by alcohol or drugs. Staff will be appropriately trained in such procedures
- 35. Where strobes, lasers, smoke machines or any other special effects equipment may be used, a written health and safety policy covering all aspects of their use will be provided, and staff will be appropriately trained
- 36. No strobes, lasers, smoke machines or any other special effects, will be used at the premises unless there is a clearly displayed warning at the entrance to the premises that such equipment is in use

#### The prevention of public nuisance

37. Noise shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises after 23:00 hours and when entertainment takes place on a regular basis at all times

- 38. No bottles shall be placed in the external receptacle after 23:00 hours to minimise noise disturbance to adjoining properties
- 39. Clear and legible notices shall be displayed at exits and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors, sounding horns and loud use of vehicle stereos and anti social behaviour. The activity or persons leaving the premises shall be monitored and they shall be reminded to leave quietly where necessary

# The protection of children from harm

40. Children under 16 will not be permitted to sit or stand at the point of sale (Bar)



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

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

Thankyou for your application which is dated 21 July 2011 which was received at Millgarth Police Station on 12 August 2011. This application was subsequently amended with the most up to date plans and correspondence being received on 19 August 2011.

This application seeks to vary the existing premises licence to allow the following activities in both the inside and outside space.

Indoor Sporting Events
Live Music
Recorded Music
Anything of a Similar Description

Every day 1000hrs x 0000hrs

Sale of Alcohol

Sunday to Thursday 1000hrs x 0000hrs Friday and Saturday 1000hrs x 01000hrs

These hours are already in place for the internal aspects of the premises and are covered by the current premises licence. This application seeks to extend the sale of alcohol and provision of regulated entertainment into the external area, with the installation of a 'bottle bar' in a garage to the rear of the premises.

It is the opinion of West Yorkshire Police, that your application contains insufficient information on how you will achieve the licensing objectives. In particular, we cannot be satisfied at this stage that, if granted the premises would not adversely affect crime and disorder and/or public nuisance in the locality.

The Kippax area has been designated a designated public place (DPPO) for approximately two years. The area suffers periodically from problems associated with anti-social behaviour and priority crime with Kippax being a hot spot in the wards of Garforth, Swillington, Kippax and Methley (Garforth NPT area).

Whilst recorded data shows both increases and decreases month on month around ASB, particularly rowdy and inconsiderate behaviour, the area still remains very busy when you consider the main shopping area and the area where many of the pubs and off licence premises are situated, is on two main streets. The White Swan is on the cross roads of these two main streets.

Kippax suffers from problems with youths congregating at various hot spots and also visiting licensed premises to try and obtain alcohol underage. This is something that the Neighbourhood Policing Team for the Garforth, Kippax, Swillington and Methley NPT has been addressing and continue to address. Whilst very little is recorded which is location specific, because of a period of closure, the problems in the area continue

The application, at Part P, refers to there being security staff being employed at 'busy times'. There is no indication of when these times will be or what firm arrangements are in place to employ door staff should the application be granted. In this section it also refers to the security staff being employed 'to make sure customers can purchase drinks and keep the area tidy'. I would suggest that the door staff are not employed for this reason and that they are present to assist in upholding the licensing objectives, there is no mention of this.

Whilst in Part P of the application you have stated that under 18s will only be allowed on the premises until 2030hrs, you have not referred to any other measure you intend to put in place to try and uphold the licensing objectives. I note the premises do not have a condition around CCTV which would be a consideration when such a significant change is applied for. You do however have condition around a refusals policy and a pub watch condition.

FOR THE REASONS SET OUT ABOVE WEST YORKSHIRE POLICE ARE OF THE OPINION THAT THIS APPLICATION SHOULD BE REFUSED IN FULL.
