Summary of main issues

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence for Northbar, 468 Roundhay Road, Leeds, LS8 2HU.

The application is for the Sale by Retail of Alcohol, Late night refreshment, Recorded music as detailed in 3.3.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted representations from other persons.

1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence.

3.0 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Northbar Ltd,
- 3.2 The application form may be found at Appendix A to this report.

4.0 Other matters relevant to the application

4.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

5.0 Steps to promote the Licensing Objectives

5.1 The applicant proposes to take specific steps to promote the licensing objectives identified in the Pro-forma Risk Assessment. A copy of which may be found at Appendix A.

6.0 Proposed Designated Premises Supervisor

6.1 Katharine Hartley intends to be the Designated Premises Supervisor.

7.0 Location

7.1 A map which identifies the location of this premise is attached at Appendix B.

8.0 Representations

8.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or other persons. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of another person, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

- 8.4 However following discussions with the Environmental Protection Team the applicant has reduced the hours originally applied for. These changes are reflected in the report.
- 8.5 Other representations
- 8.6 The application has attracted representations from other persons.
- 8.7 The licensing section is in receipt of five letters of support and one letter of objection. The letter of objection is opposed to this application on the grounds of public nuisance and crime and disorder.
- 8.8 Copies of the representation and support letters will be available at the hearing for Members consideration.

9.0 Options Available to Members

- 9.1 The Licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 9.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.

Site Context

The property at 468 Roundhay Road has previously been used as an estate agency, and is set back from the road by 5 metres.

The property is located centrally in a retail parade. The parade has is fully mixed containing an opticians, a printers, stationers and a bathroom store. To our knowledge there are no other A4 uses in this area of Oakwood.

Roundhay Road is a busy street which connects the city to its north eastern suburbs and to further afield. The street is used as a major artery by public transport. The site sits opposite a retail parade and a small supermarket.



The property

468 Roundhay Road has been vacant for over two years, its most recent use being a Halifax Building society estate agency. The upper floors have been vacant for a similar timescale. Our proposal would add vibrancy and footfall to the parade.



The existing premises

The fascia of the proposed premises will be in keeping with the property and the locality. The new fascia sign will be kept well within the area of the existing / previous signage. The current frontage is of outstanding design, one which we intend to fully reinstate in its original condition.



Parking, Highway access and servicing

Being in a sustainable town centre location the proposal does not make any provision for car parking. The development will encourage use of the extensive public transport found in the area. We anticipate the huge majority of customers will come from the local area – most arriving by foot.

Servicing will take place infrequently with around 4 deliveries to the site per week. These will take place outside of peak traffic flow times. Highway access will be from the road to the rear of the property (Back Oakwood Avenue), all servicing will take place at this point. This will remove any potential issues from Roundhay Road itself.

Access Statement

Access to the site

The property located at 468 Roundhay Road, is accessed from Roundhay Road. All pedestrians will access the property via the large pavement / patio to the front of the property. The nearest car access is some 5 metres away from the property on Roundhay Road itself.

The Patio slopes gently upwards towards the property allowing access to all.

Approach

The path to the main entrance door is slightly graded to allow full access to the property. Mat wells will be provided where necessary.

Circulation

The public area of the property will be to the the ground floor of the property only. The fully accessible ground floor will house the bar area / bar and Wc.

WC's

The WC on the ground floor fully complies with Part M and allows for use of the toilet and accommodation of the wheelchair during use.

Conclusion

Access for customers has been considered and all reasonable provision will be made for people to gain access to the building and use the facilities within.


