Summary of main issues

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence, made by Stella Bhebhe, for AS Convenience Stores 1 Shafton Lane, Holbeck, Leeds, LS11 9LY

1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

2.1 This is a first application for a premises licence

4.0 Other matters relevant to the application

4.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

5.0 Steps to promote the Licensing Objectives

5.1 The applicant proposes to take specific steps to promote the licensing objectives identified in section M of the application form.

6.0 Stella Bhebhe intends to be the Designated Premises Supervisor

7.0 Licensing Hours

- 7.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.8 to 6.15 for the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 7.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.14 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so. The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not impact on the licensing objectives, given the potential for neighbouring premises to seek the same additional hours to prevent rivals gaining a commercial advantage.
- 7.3 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at appendix **F**

8.0 Location

8.1 A map which identifies the location of this premise is attached at Appendix **B**.

9.0 Representations

- 9.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or other persons. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of another person, must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 9.2 Representations from Responsible Authorities
- 9.3 Representation has been received from West Yorkshire Police in their capacity as a responsible authority
- 9.4 Any representation submitted may be agreed prior to a hearing. In this instance the operating schedule has been amended to include measures agreed with West Yorkshire Police. A copy of which may be found at Appendix **C**
- 9.5 Other representations
- 9.5.1 The application has attracted representations from other persons.
- 9.5.2 The Licensing Department has received a representation from a member of the public on the grounds of public safety and public nuisance.
- 9.5.3 A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix **D**
- 9.5.4 The applicant has submitted a letter listing the steps that have been undertaken to negotiate with the objector, Members attention is directed to Appendix **E** attached

- 9.5.5 Options Available to Members
- 9.6 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 9.7 Members of the licensing Sub Committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.







I understand that Bargain Booze Select Convenience have made application to vary the license on their property in Main Street, Garforth and that this variation is as follows:-

To extend their license to sell alcohol from the existing Monday to Saturday 10.00-22.00 and Sunday 12.00-22.00 to the proposed every day 07.00-23.00.
 The applicant also wishes to remove non-standard timings and restrictions placed upon the license regarding Easter Sunday. Namely the condition which reads 'The proposed hours of Easter Sunday trading shall be restricted to 10.00-16.00.

 Non Standard Timings - 23rd, 24th and 31st December 08.00-22.00

The extension of sales of alcohol on Main Street, Garforth will directly impact:-

a) Crime & Disorder and Public Nuisance
Late at night drunken individuals - often underage - are to be found on Main Street and in
two adjacent areas of residence and relaxation. Just 125 meters from this shop is an area in
Fidler's Lane where young people gather to drink their purchases.

Garforth Neighbourhood Policing Team continue to deal with youths causing anti-social
behaviour in Barleyhill Park. The park, which covers an area between 225 and 350 metres
from Bargain Booze premises on Main Street, is surrounded by residential property. The
park provides a gathering place for the consumption of alcohol which on a regular basis leads
to illegal behaviour often involving motor vehicles in the adjacent car park. This is the area
which backs on to my own property. Young people have spent all night drinking in some of
these areas.

The language, aggressive attitude and intimidating behaviour of these groups of young people - particularly late in the evening - is damaging to the quality of life of the local residents and is also a great disincentive to make use of the pedestrian access through these areas.

b) Protection of children

The alcohol sold is often in bottles and this provides additional entertainment for drinkers. The sound of these empty bottles crashing around the children's play park area, and on two occasions over the wall from the flats in Barleyhill Road into Lyndon Avenue, is a public nuisance to those of us who live in this area. More importantly the resultant broken glass is a danger to any young children, who may or may not be accompanied by an adult, on any early morning visits to the park, or the area outside their own homes in the case of the Lyndon Avenue incident.

This is particularly true over public holidays and at the weekends when the resulting litter of cans and broken bottles may not be cleared promptly.

There is already a Tesco supermarket less than a mile from Bargain Booze Select Convenience open until 24.00 for the sale of alcohol, and for this and all the above reasons I would ask that the licensing committee reject this application.

The present licence allows them to sell alcohol between 10:00 and 22:00.



We would also question the need to open at 7am every day of the week. If people are so desperate to buy booze at this time of the morning they need help, not a handy outlet for alcohol.
