Summary of main issues

This is an application for the grant of a premises licence, made by Mr Richard Todd, for Slam Dunk Festival, Rose Bowl Car Park, Portland Crescent, Portland Gate And Cookridge Street, Leeds.

The application is made for two outdoor stages playing live music, one located on the Rose Bowl car park and one on Cookridge Street. Bars will in situ around the stages providing alcoholic and soft drinks.

The application explains that the event will take place on one day only. The 3 dates applied for are to allow flexibility for future years but the event will always remain as a one day event. The Monday applied for will only be utilised if the event was to fall on a Bank Holiday weekend.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The application has attracted representation from the West Yorkshire Police and Health & Safety Team. Both representations offer suggested measures, which at the time of writing this report, remain outstanding and a matter for Member's consideration.

Members should also note that these premises are located within the Amber Zone of Leeds City Council's Cumulative Impact Policy, detailed further at 9.0 of this report.

Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

2.1 This is the first application for a premises licence for this site.

3.0 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Mr Richard Todd.
- 3.2 The application form can be found at Appendix A to this report.
- 3.3 In summary the application is for:

Supply of Alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises 12:00 until 23:00 hrs Saturday, Sunday and Monday

Live Music
Recorded Music
Performance of Dance
Entertainment Similar to the above provisions
09:00 until 23:00 hrs Saturday, Sunday and Monday

Non-Standard Timings:

No non-standard timings for Bank Holidays or special occasions are proposed.

4.0 Other matters relevant to the application

4.1 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

5.0 Steps to promote the Licensing Objectives

5.1 The applicant proposes to take the steps specified in Section 18 of the application form in order to promote the licensing objectives.

6.0 Proposed Designated Premises Supervisor

6.1 Mr Richard Todd intends to be the Designated Premises Supervisor.

7.0 Licensing Hours

- 7.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.8 to 6.15 for the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 7.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.14 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so. The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not impact on the licensing objectives, given the potential for neighbouring premises to seek the same additional hours to prevent rivals gaining a commercial advantage.
- 7.3 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at appendix B.

8.0 Location

8.1 A map which identifies the location of this premise is attached at Appendix C.

9.0 Cumulative Impact Policy

- 9.1 These premises are located within the Amber Zone of Leeds City Centre Cumulative Impact Area (Area 1).
- 9.2 Cumulative impact means the potential impact on the promotion of the licensing ojectives here there are a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area.
- 9.3 An applicant wishing to obtain a new licence for premises falling within any of the cumulative impact areas must identify through the risk assessment process and/or operating schedule the steps that they intends to take so that the council and responsible authorities can be satisfied with that granting of a new licence will not add to the impact already being experienced.
- 9.4 Details of the Cumulative Impact Policy specific to Area 1, and an outline of the evidence behind the reason for setting the policy is attached at Appendix D of this report.

10.0 Representations

- 10.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or other persons. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of another person, must not be frivolous or vexatious.
- 10.2 Representations from Responsible Authorities
- 10.3 Representation has been received from West Yorkshire Police offering measures to uphold the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective. At the time of

writing this report, this representation remains outstanding and a matter for Member's consideration. A copy of this representation can be viewed at Appendix E.

- The application has also attracted representation from the Health & Safety Team. In this instance the measures suggested are in order to promote the Public Safety licensing objective and subject to no agreement being reached, are attached at Appendix F for Members to consider.
- 10.5 Other representations
- 10.5.1 No other representations have been received in respect of this application.

11.0 Options Available to Members

- 11.1 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the application as requested.
 - Grant the application whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Refuse to specify the said person as the designated premises supervisor.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 11.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.





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




City Centre CIP

Licensing Act 2003





Area 1 relates to the city centre. West Yorkshire Police have provide information that the nature of the city centre is such that the problem areas and cumulative impact is directly related to the style of businesses opening in that area and their clientele.

In addition the close proximity of a number of venues on a street can result in difficulties in identifying individual premises as causing problems which can be dealt with via an action plan or a review process.

As a consequence the closure or opening of businesses can have a dramatic effect on reported crime and reported incidents in an area. While individual premises are dealt with using the review process, there are areas in Leeds city centre which may temporarily become saturated as new businesses open or existing businesses change their style of operation.

In addition the council recognises that a previous problem area can be improved by the introduction of new styles of business types, such as food led premises, and seeks to encourage this.

This dynamic nature has created difficulties in setting a policy for the city centre that will be relevant for five years until the next formal review. Therefore the council will adopt an approach of designating areas within the city centre CIP as 'red' or 'amber' based upon an analysis of night time economy related issues that are relevant to the licensing objectives. Areas that are considered highly saturated will be designated as red areas.

The council will seek to refuse all applications in these **red areas** on the basis that the impact on the licensing objectives are at such a level that the area cannot support any more premises opening or extending their hours no matter how impressive the concept or application is. The council will only grant applications in the red zone in exceptional cases.

An **amber area** is an area which is of concern based upon an analysis of night time economy related issues that are relevant to the licensing objectives, and the council will expect applicants to offer additional measures tailored to the problems in that area.

All other areas within the city centre CIP will be designated **green areas** where good quality applications will be generally be more acceptable even though the area is a CIP area.

The current map and evidence is available on the council's website and from Entertainment Licensing.

It is the council's policy, on receipt of relevant representations, to

- refuse new and variation applications in the red area
- to seek additional measures for new and variation applications in the amber area
- To seek good quality applications for application in the green area

This applies to alcohol led premises such as bars, pubs and nightclubs, and for premises seeking late night refreshment such as takeaways and late opening restaurants.

Analysis of Leeds City Centre high volume night-time economy related crime

Introduction

The aim of this report is to demonstrate the scale and nature of crime in the City Centre over the last few years and determine the key areas of concern.

The crimes considered for this report include:

- Thefts from person
- Thefts non specific
- Robbery
- Assault (including Affray)
- Murder/Manslaughter
- Drunk & Disorderly
- Public Order

The current Cumulative Impact Policy covers an area encompassing the entire City Centre area and this report aims to highlight smaller more significant areas for future consideration during the review process.

Data has been collated covering the last five years between 2008 and 2012 and using Cadcorp mapmodeller GIS has been mapped to determine the key areas of concern. The data for 2012 has then been examined in more detail to identify smaller zones of risk by crime type to provide a better understanding of where our risk areas are in the City by offence type.

The maps in section three and hotspots zones in section five are focussing on crimes committed in the night-time economy and not those occurring in the daytime. For the purposes of this report, the night-time economy has been defined as the period 1800 - 0600.






Map 1 – 2008




Map 2 – 2009




Figure 4 – Top Streets over the 5 year period (night-time economy only)




Figure 5 – Top Offence Types by location type (night-time economy)

6. Summary and Conclusions

- Crime* in the City Centre of Leeds has risen year on year from 2008 to 2012, going from 4959 in 2008 to 6309 in 2012.
- Crime with a link to licensed premises has followed the same increase year on year from 2008 to 2012, going from 1203 in 2008 to 2154 in 2012.
- Of the crimes linked to licensed premises, assaults have shown reductions year on year between 2008 and 2012. Conversely, thefts especially Thefts from Person crime has risen notably over the last few years, going from 222 in 2008 to 1133 in 2012.
- The street location Briggate has been ranked in the top three streets in Leeds centre each year
 for committed crime in the night-time economy between 2008 and 2012 but Call Lane has been
 ranked at the top for the last three years consecutively.
- Albion Street, Briggate and Call Lane have been ranked in the top three for the last three years in relation to night-time economy crime.
- 88% of THEP and 90% of Thefts Non Specific occur inside premises. This is opposed to violent crime in which 64% occur inside a location showing that many assaults also occur on the roadside.
- Areas A1, A2, T1 and T2 are all focussed on the same areas and these account for the majority of night-time economy related crime. Other areas also overlap and it is these areas within section five that are recommended to be included on any Cumulative Impact Policy.

Thank you for submitting your application for a new premises licence at the above address which we received on 25th November 2014.

The premises are situated in an area of the Leeds City Centre, which is currently subject to a policy of Cumulative Impact, as identified in the current 2014-2018 Statement of Licensing Policy of Leeds City Council.

This particular area of the City, is classed as being an "amber area".

In accordance with the licensing authority's document quoted above, as an amber area, on receipt of relevant representations to promote the licensing objectives, it is the council's policy to seek additional measures, to address the problems associated within that area.

West Yorkshire Police are of the opinion that your application contains insufficient information about how you intend to meet the licensing objectives.

We therefore confirm that we are submitting a formal representation against your application on the grounds of-:

- 1. the prevention of crime & disorder
- 2. public safety
- 3. public nuisance

As I understand the application it is for a licence for one day of the year, every year from 2015, for a music event known as Slam Dunk. The capacity of this licence will be 3,750 which will be added to the capacity of the existing licences to be used, 11,000, creating an event with the capacity for 14,750 in the middle of the city centre. The main concern for West Yorkshire Police is associated crime and/or disorder which may occur as well as public safety and nuisance issues, undermining the licensing objectives.

However, West Yorkshire Police are also of the opinion that the said objectives could be met should you be prepared to incorporate certain identified measures within your operating schedule, in <u>addition</u> to what you may have offered in your application.

Please find enclosed a document which at **Part 1** contains the suggested measures which this authority considers are proportionate and appropriate to the nature of your application.

Should you be in agreement with the suggested measures then please signify this by completing and signing **Part 2** of the enclosed form and return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

Upon receipt of your consent at **Part 2**, it will be taken that you signify your wishes for the licensing authority to amend your operating schedule to incorporate the proposed measures.

Alternatively should you disagree with the proposed measures, then please complete **Part 3** and again return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

PART 1 - to be completed by the Responsible Authority:

West Yorkshire Police propose the following control measures under the Licensing Act 2003 (in <u>addition</u> to those that you may have already offered), for the premises-:

ROSE BOWL CAR PARK/PORTLAND CRESCENT/PORTLAND GATE/COOKRIDGE STREET

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003 for the above premises, West Yorkshire Police considers that the following measures are relevant, proportionate and necessary in order to promote the following licensing objectives:

- the prevention of crime & disorder
- public safety
- public nuisance

Measures / Additional measures proposed:

- The premises licence shall be surrendered if unacceptable levels of crime and/or disorder, as defined by West Yorkshire Police, are directly linked to the event in May 2015.
- A multi-agency planning team is to oversee and approve the arrangements for all aspects of the event to ensure it is delivered safely and with due regard to all four licensing objectives.
- The licence is granted subject to the completion and circulation of an Event Management Plan to the responsible authorities 90 days before the start of the event.
- The nature of the event/audience profile will not be changed without the consent of the Responsible Authority.

- The public will not be admitted to the licensed site until such time that the Licence Holder/nominated person is satisfied that the site is safe and suitable for its intended use.
- Any authorised officer of the Responsible Authorities shall have free access to all
 parts of the licensed site whilst the licence is in force for the purposes of supervising
 the compliance of this Risk Assessment Pro-forma and Event.
- An Event Safety Co-ordinator will be appointed who shall be of sufficient competence, status and authority effectively to take responsibility for safety at the event and be able to authorise and supervise safety measures. The Event Safety Coordinator and deputy shall have no other additional duties.
- Event Safety Coordinator will ensure that periodic wind speed measurements are taken throughout the event. The results of these measurements are to be recorded and made available to the Licensing Authority.
- Comprehensive and detailed colour plans shall be supplied with the Event Management Plan to all Responsible Authorities. The plans shall be to a scale and grid referenced to the standards required by the Responsible Authorities.

The Plans should contain the following items (not exhaustive):

- All boundary fencing (defining the arena, backstage areas, etc)
- All vehicle access routes, including routes for emergency vehicles
- The locations and reference number of all entrance and exit points/gates (including backstage and emergency access points);
 - All structures (type / use identified)
 - Fire Points
 - First Aid Points
 - Toilet Blocks
 - Water Points
 - Welfare provisions, lost & found etc.
 - CCTV locations
 - Security Control
 - Production office etc.
 - Plans should identify highway routes to the site, car parks, entrances/exits to car parks, pick-up points, etc external to the site. It may therefore be necessary to supplement the site plans with colour coded/ grid referenced area maps for this purpose.

There will be no changes to the plans without the consent of the Responsible Authorities.

- Public Liability and Third Party Insurance adequate for the total capacity of the licensed site and the duration of the event shall be taken out and retained on the site.
- A supervisors' register will be maintained at the licensed site to identify the names and licence details of any other Personal Licence Holders at the licensed site who are to authorise the sale of alcohol. This register will be produced for inspection by any authorised officer of the Responsible Authorities, and shall be retained by the Licence Holder / nominated person for a period of 6 months after the event.
- The security and safety of the public whilst on the licensed site will be the responsibility of the Premises Licence Holder.
- The Event Management Plan will contain detailed information of the CCTV system to be used, including the location of cameras, monitoring and recording arrangements and the retention of recorded information.
- Any changes to the CCTV arrangements may only be made upon agreement with the

- Responsible Authorities.
- Sufficient number of security staff and stewards shall be provided in accordance with the current Event Safety Guide (Purple Book), or to any other standards / numbers as agreed with the Responsible Authorities.
- The event Management Plan will contain a Security and Stewarding Plan, including details of the security command structure, the numbers of security and stewarding personnel, their locations, duties and responsibilities, methods of communication, means of identification (including personal identification), briefing arrangements and contingency plans.
- The Security & Stewarding Plan will not be changed without the agreement of the Responsible Authorities.
 - **Security & Steward Personnel Register:**
- A register will be maintained to record all security and steward personnel working on the licensed site. Details recorded in the register will include: the full name of each individual employed, accompanied by their date of birth, home address, employer, their unique personal identification number allocated for the purpose of the event, and registration number held with the SIA (if applicable). The register must also contain records of the date and times during which the individuals commenced and finished duty which a signed acknowledgement by each individual.
- The register will be maintained at the licensed site and be produced for inspection by any authorised officer of the Responsible Authorities.
- The Licence holder will retain the register for a period of 6 months following the event.
- A search Policy for patrons entering the licensed site will be provided to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authorities.
- A Search Policy will be contained within the Event Management Plan.
- Notices will be displayed at the entrances of the site which state:
 - A search will be conducted as a condition of entry to the site;
 - Incidents of crime and disorder will be reported to the police;
- Entry to the site will be refused to any person who appears to be drunk, acting in a threatening manner or is violent;
 - Entry will be refused to any person who has been convicted of an offence of drunkenness, violent or threatening behaviour or the use or distribution of illegal substances.
 - Members of the public who commit acts of anti-social behaviour will be removed from the site and prevented from returning.
 - Any such instances will be recorded in the Incident Report Register.
 - Any seizure of drugs or offensive weapons shall be recorded in the Incident Report Register and reported to the West Yorkshire Police.
 - A suitable receptacle for the safe retention of illegal substances will be provided and arrangements made for the safe disposal of its contents as agreed with West Yorkshire Police.
 - Written records of all accidents and safety incidents involving members of the public will be kept in the form of an Incident Report Register.
 - The register will be maintained on the licensed site and produced for inspection by an authorised officer of the Responsible Authorities.
 - The Licence holder will retain the register for a period of 6 months following the event.
 - Glass containers and cans will not be taken into the licensed area/s occupied by the public.

- No glass, glass bottles or cans shall be sold or supplied in the licensed area.
- Notices will be prominently displayed at entrance/s to the site which inform customers that glass containers and cans may not be taken into the site.
- Sealed skips will be used for the deposit of glass containers.
- The Licence Holder shall ensure that the capacity of the site is controlled and does not exceed the figure as agreed with the Responsible Authorities.
- The Event Management Plan will include policies and procedures on:
 - Entry to the site (including monitoring of any capacity limit)
- Crowd control and management once the public are in the site (ie front stage pressure)
 - Capacity control within any structure/marquee
- $\, \bullet \,$ Egress from the Site a policy to ensure the gradual dispersal of customers from the site
 - Emergency Evacuation of the site
 - All relevant staff shall be trained on these measures, and all other matters relating to the safety of the public.
 - All access and egress routes, sanitary accommodation, drinking water, first aid points, campsites, car parks and security control units shall be adequately and conspicuously signposted at all times. All access and egress gates are to be provided with relevant gate numbers identifiable from both inside and outside the arena and correspond with the site plan.
 - Emergency exit gates shall be appropriately identified.
 - Emergency vehicle access routes to the arena and all parts of the Licensed Site shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authorities.
 - Emergency vehicle access routes shall be clearly signposted and shall be kept clear
 of obstructions at all times.
 - The licensee has a fire risk assessment under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. This will be made available at the request of an authorised officer.
 - A full safety check of the licensed site, including the availability of exit gates and routes for pedestrians and emergency vehicles, will be carried out prior to the admission of the public.
 - Periodic safety checks will be carried out whilst the public are on the site.
 - Records of all such checks will be maintained on the licensed site and produced for inspection by an authorised officer of the Responsible Authorities.
 - The Licence holder will ensure that such records are maintained for a period of 6 months after the event.
 - All staging, ramps, stairs front of house barriers and other structures erected on the Licensed Site in connection with the event will comply with the provisions of the HSE Event Safety Guide, and the relevant safety regulations appertaining to the structure.
 - The event Management Plan will contain a schedule of the temporary structures to be installed on site including details of the dimensions / loadings, history of use and details of the suppliers / installation arrangements.
 - The locations of all temporary structures will be identified on the site plan.
 - All temporary structures shall be suitable and fit for their intended purpose and installed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
 - No additional temporary structures will be allowed on the site other than those for which the details have previously been submitted to and approved by the Responsible Authorities.

- Completion certificates for all temporary structures will be obtained prior to the admission of the public to the licensed site.
 - Certificates will be maintained on the site for inspection by any authorised officer and retained for a period of 6 months after the event.
- Regular safety inspections of temporary structures shall be undertaken. A written record of these inspections will be kept.
 - The records will be maintained on site for inspection by an authorised officer and retained for a period of 6 months after.
- A supervision policy will be maintained to prevent people from inappropriate behaviour, including climbing which may lead to a fall from height.
- All floor surfaces will be suitably slip resistant, kept in good condition and free of obstructions to prevent slips, trips and falls
- 28 days prior to the event Environmental Health Services shall be provided with a full list of food concession units detailing their names, addresses, type of operation and proposed locations within the licensed site. The licensee or sole franchise holder shall ensure that no other food concessionaires other than those already notified are admitted to the licensed site.
- At the request of an Environmental Health Officer, any food operation not complying with the food hygiene and Health and Safety at Work legislation shall be closed down.
- The provision of and location of all refreshment / concessionaire facilities shall be positioned well away from the stage and not obstruct access to any exit from the Licensed Site.
- All concession units shall remain stationary whilst the public are on the site and shall remain stationary for a minimum of 30 minutes once the public have left the site.
- Medical provisions calculated on the attendance figures for the event will be supplied in accordance with the current version of the HSE Event Safety Guide (Purple Book, or to any other standards / numbers as agreed with the Responsible Authorities.
- The Event Management Plan will contain a Medical Plan, which will include details of the medical provider, a breakdown of the numbers, qualifications and experience of medical personnel.
- The Medical Plan will also have particular reference to the quantity and quality of the first aid points, including the size, location, signage, electricity, lighting, flooring, water supply and access by emergency vehicles.
- First aid points will be identified on the site plan.
- If paramedics are to be deployed their registration numbers must be provided to the appropriate Ambulance Authority at least 28 days prior to the start of the event.
- Public access to any part of the licensed site will be subject to confirmation that the Medical Provider and adequate first aid cover is in place.
- The Medical Co-ordinator shall be provided with details of the intended programme of acts and activities and shall ensure that any alterations to the programme are notified immediately.
- A written procedure for dealing with unwell members of the public will be in place including those who appear to be affected by alcohol or drugs. All relevant staff will be appropriately trained in such procedures.
- The Event Management Plan will contain a written health and safety policy covering all aspects of the safe use of strobes lasers, smoke machines or any other special effects.
- Details of all Lasers to be used during the event must be provided to the Leeds City Council Health and Safety team no later than 28 days prior to the event.

- The Licensing Authority shall be provided with 28 days' notice of details of any tattooists or body piercers which are to trade on the Licensed site.
- The event Management Plan shall contain a procedure for the safe evacuation of disabled persons. Staff will be trained in the procedure and a record kept of such training.
- Sufficient drinking water points will be placed around the licensed site for the adequate supply of free, potable and wholesome drinking water for visitors throughout the event. Provisions will be made for an alternative supply of drinking water in case of failure of planned sources of drinking water.
- All sanitation and drinking water supplies shall be in position and serviced prior to the admission of the public to the site.
- A traffic management plan will be provided to the satisfaction of all relevant agencies. This will include details of:
 - Traffic Routes
 - Traffic Regulation orders
 - Traffic Signage
 - Car Parks
 - · Management of vehicle gates
 - Traffic Spotters
 - Tow Away Facilities
 - · Advanced information in the media
 - Use of Public Transport / Coaches
 - Pedestrian Access Facilities
- The plans of the licensed site shall identify routes for emergency vehicles around the licensed site and location of car parks. This plan should be supplemented with area maps identifying traffic routes to the site, access & egress points to car parka and the identified access/egress routes for emergency vehicles (unless this information may be contained on the same site plan).
- All vehicular access points into the Licensed Site shall be provided to a standard appropriate for the nature and volume of traffic shall be laid out and constructed to the satisfaction of the Responsible Authorities.
- No licensable activities shall take place in the licensed area of Portland Gate and Portland Crescent.
- There will be a communication link via radio to other venues in the city centre. This
 will be the system recognised by the current Business Crime Reduction Partnership
 for the city, Leeds City Council and West Yorkshire Police
- Such communication link will be kept in working order at all times when licensable activities are taking place
- The communication link will be available to the Designated Premises Supervisor or other nominated supervisor and be monitored by that person at all times that licensed activities are being carried out.
- Alcoholic drinks will not be taken from the premises at any time
- Alcoholic drinks will not be allowed in the licensed area known as Portland Gate and Portland Crescent.
- Notices indicating the existence and effect of an Alcohol Designated Public Places
 Order will be prominently displayed at the exits to the premises.

West Yorkshire Police are satisfied that the proposed measures are not adequately dealt with by other legislation.

By signing the declaration enclosed overleaf at **Part 2**, the applicant agrees to incorporate the proposed measures within the Operating Schedule for the said premises.

Upon the satisfactory completion of the declaration, West Yorkshire Police will provide notice to the Licensing Authority that our representation is withdrawn in accordance with schedule 10(a) of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

Application Details & Location:

The application is for the Slam Dunk rock festival that will take place within Leeds City Centre. Although the full festival will involve other sites and existing licensed premises nearby, this application (PREM/03552/001) relates to two outdoor stages located at Leeds Beckett University Rose Bowl car park (stage 4), Cookridge Street (stage 3) and surrounding areas and streets including Portland Crescent, Portland Gate and Cookridge Street as identified in the submitted application and plan.

To allow flexibility in future years it is understood that the application is for licensable activities to take place over 3 days (Saturday, Sunday & Monday) although the actual event will only be for 1 day over a Bank Holiday weekend starting Saturday 23rd May 2015.

The opening hours to the public for the event applied for are 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs, with the provision of live music from 9:00hrs to 23:00hrs, recorded music from 9:00hrs to 23:00hrs, performance of dance from 12:00hrs to 23:00hrs, and the supply the supply of alcohol from 12:00 to 23:00. However from supporting documentation previously provided to Environmental Health Services it is understood that access to the site for the public will be 13:00hrs with live music from 14:00hrs and the event finishing 23:00hrs.

Potential Public Nuisance Issues:

There are a number of the potential issues that could affect sensitive receptors when holding the event which need to be addressed and managed including:

Noise from:

- Music and other regulated entertainment during performances;
- Music and other regulated entertainment during sound checks and sound propagation tests;
- The use of pyrotechnics and/or fireworks during performances or stage presentations;
- Activities and work associated with assembling and disassembling stages and any supporting infrastructure before and after the event;
- The movement of vehicles to, from and within the site before/after the event such as those transporting equipment and infrastructure;

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- Unloading and loading of the equipment and supporting infrastructure;
- Staff and patrons before, during and after the event;
- Activities associated with any bars, concessions or funfair-type attractions if provided;
- The use mobile plant and/or machinery such as generators to provide light and power;
- Waste collection and delivery vehicles;

Lighting:

- The use of spot and stage lights during performances and/or sound checks;
- The use of any arc type lights during assembly and disassembly of the stages and infrastructure:
- The use of spot lights and/or other lighting associated within licensed areas;

Odours:

 Odours from cooking activities associated with any food stalls, especially those selling/serving hot food;

Litter & Waste:

- o Flyers and other advertisements provided in relation to the event;
- Littering and waste from patrons;
- Waste from the operation of the event and from any associated businesses and/or concessions.

Location of Sensitive Receptors:

Although application site is located within Leeds city centre there is the potential for nearby sensitive receptors and premises to be affected by noise, vibration, light and odour from the event and which would need to identified, controlled and managed.

Within close proximity there are educational premises, in particular the Leeds Beckett University teaching spaces and the Learning Centre, several offices, commercial & business premises. Although holding the event over a Bank Holiday weekend would reduce any potential for disturbance to nearby offices, there would still remain the potential for any business or office premises operating nearby during the event to be affected.

There are also a large number of residential premises within close proximity and in some case encompassed and adjacent the application site which will need careful consideration.

This includes:

- The new Hilton hotel on Portland Crescent which is bounded by both the stage 4 area
 of the site in the Rose Bowl car park and stage 3 area on Cookridge Street;
- Flats within 97 Portland Crescent adjacent the application site;
- Over 200 flats located at The Plaza, Clay Pit Lane approx.190-225m away;
- Premier Inn (hotel) at Hepworth Point, Clay Pit Lane approx. 230-250m away;
- Over 200 student flats located at Central Village, adjacent Leeds Beckett University
 City Campus on Woodhouse Lane approx. 175-270m away;
- Leeds General Infirmary, Calverley Street, approx. 175-220m away;
- Flats located on Portland Place, Calverley Street, approx. 250-280m away.

This is not a definitive list and there are potentially further sensitive receptors in close proximity to the site.

Conclusions:

Having considered the application under the Licensing Act 2003, we consider that the following measures are relevant and reasonable in order to meet the following aim of the licence:

Prevention of Public Nuisance

 An Event Management Plan shall be provided to the satisfaction of Leeds City Council's Environmental Health Services. A draft version shall be provided at least 60 days before commencement of the event. A final version shall be provided at least 30 days before the commencement of the event.

The said strategy shall identify how noise and public nuisance issues from the holding of the festival will be effectively controlled so as to prevent public nuisance and show full compliance with any relevant licence conditions.
