Summary of main issues

This is an application to vary a premises licence, made by Greene King Retailing Limited, for Maverick's 80's Lounge (formerly Brown Cow) 62 Town Street, Horsforth, Leeds, LS18 4AP.

The purpose of the variation is to seek approval to extend the sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment hours and to remove and replace certain conditions on the premises licence. As detailed in 3.0.

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

This application has attracted representations from other persons and responsible authorities.

The premises are located within an area covered by a Cumulative Impact Policy.

1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

- 2.1 An application to vary an existing Justices 'On' licence was received on the 20th July 2005.
- 2.2 The variation received representations from West Yorkshire Police and Environmental Health. A hearing was scheduled but due to agreements being reached with the responsible authorities the hearing was dispensed with. The application was deemed granted with conditions imposed by the relevant authorities added to the licence.
- 2.3 Since the initial application, various applications have been received to vary the designated premises supervisor.
- 2.4 A variation application was received on the 4th September 2015. This application is to vary the sale of alcohol hours and to remove and replace certain conditions on the premises licence.
- 2.5 A copy of the existing licence is attached at Appendix A.

3.0 The Application

- 3.1 The applicant is Greene King Retailing Limited.
- 3.2 The operating schedule appropriate to this application may be found at Appendix B to this report.
- 3.3 In summary the application is to remove and replace certain conditions on the premises licence. Please see below the activities and times the premises have attached on their licence at present..

The application is made to extend the sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment activities by an extension of 1 hour.

4.0 Other matters relevant to the application

4.1 Equality and Diversity / Cohesion and Integration

4.2 At the time of writing this report there were no implications for equality and diversity. Any decision taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee will be in accordance with the four licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

5.0 Steps to promote the Licensing Objectives

5.1 The applicant proposes to take specific step to promote the licensing objectives identified in section 'P' of the application form.

6.0 Licensing Hours

- 6.1 Members are directed to paragraphs 6.8 to 6.15 for the Statement of Licensing Policy which states the criteria that will be applied to any decision for new applications or variations which include extending hours.
- 6.2 In brief the Policy states at 6.14 that restrictions may be made to the proposed hours of use where, after receiving relevant representations, the council considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so. The council will take into account the existing pattern of licensed premises in an area when considering what is appropriate to promote the objectives. Applications which are significantly out of character for a locality will need to demonstrate that granting the hours sought will not impact on the licensing objectives, given the potential for neighbouring premises to seek the same additional hours to prevent rivals gaining a commercial advantage.
- 6.3 A list of premises in the local area and their licensed hours and activities is provided at Appendix C.

7.0 Location

7.1 A map which identifies the location of this premises is attached at Appendix D.

8.0 Cumulative Impact Policy

- 8.1 The premises are located within the Cumulative Impact Area 5 Horsforth.
- 8.2 Cumulative impact means the potential impact on the promotion of the licensing ojectives here there are a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area.
- 8.3 An applicant wishing to obtain a new licence for premises falling within any of the cumulative impact areas must identify through the risk assessment process and/or operating schedule the steps that they intends to take so that the council and responsible authorities can be satisfied with that granting of a new licence will not add to the impact already being experienced.

8.4 Details of the Cumulative Impact Policy specific to Horsforth and an outline of the evidence behind the reason for setting this Policy is attached at Appendix E.

9.0 Representations

9.1 Under the Act representations can be received from responsible authorities or other persons. Representations must be relevant and, in the case of another person, must not be frivolous or vexatious.

9.2 <u>Representations from Responsible Authorities</u>

- 9.2.1 Representations have been received from the Licensing Authority and Environmental Health in their capacity as responsible authorities.
- 9.2.2 The representation from Environmental Health has been withdrawn due to the applicant agreeing to the conditions imposed by the responsible authority. Please see Appendix F.
- 9.2.3 The representation submitted by the Licensing Authority remains as a matter for members consideration. A copy of the same may be found at Appendix G.

9.3 Other representations

- 9.3.1 The application has attracted representations from other persons.
- 9.3.2 The licensing section is in receipt of 2 individual letters of objection which are opposed to this application on the grounds of public nuisance and are attached at Appendix H.
- 9.3.3 The application has attracted a representation from Councillor Hughes which is attached at Appendix I.
- 9.3.4 The application has attracted a representation from Horsforth Town Council which is attached at Appendix J.

10.0 Options Available to Members

- 10.1 The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the variation as requested.
 - Grant the variation whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
 - Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 10.2 Members of the licensing subcommittee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be appropriate in order to promote the licensing objectives.



Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
 - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
 - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
 - c. damage
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
 - At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

- games or activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on
 - i. the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii. the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- e. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 8. The responsible person shall ensure that
 - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - i. beer or cider. 1/2 pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii. still wine in a glass:125 ml; and
 - b. customers are made aware of the availability of these measures
- A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 of this condition -
 - "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (D×V) where -
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" mean value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(b).

Embedded Restrictions

- 10. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours stated on this licence and:
 - a. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
 - b. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- 11. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
 - a. the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first thirty minutes after above hours;
 - b. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals.
 - c. consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
 - e. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - f. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
 - g. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
 - i. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- Where the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 the licensee shall ensure that the provisions of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 are complied with.

Conditions consistent with the operating schedule relating to the licensing objectives

The prevention of crime and disorder

- Participate in a local pub watch scheme or licensing association, (where one exists) that is recognised by the West Yorkshire Police Authority.
- Adopt a Check 21 proof of age scheme in accordance with guidance issued by West Yorkshire Police (or similar proof of age scheme).
- Operate an effective CCTV system to be maintained in accordance with guidelines issued by West Yorkshire Police Authority.
- 16. When permission is sought for the sale and supply of alcohol during non standard hours for any Bank Holiday period, an event of national interest or televised sporting event for national interest, then the following will apply:

(i) The applicant must give West Yorkshire Police at least 10 clear working days written notice of and Bank Holiday period or any other event of national interest.

(ii) The non standard hours shall only apply to one hour and one hours after a televised sporting event of national interest, and a maximum of two additional hours in any one day to any other event of national interest.

(iii) The applicant must have made one more that 12 such applications relating to either an event of national interest or televised sporting event of nation al interest in any one calendar year.

(iv) If after the 5th working day commencing the day after the request is received, West Yorkshire Police do not respond, then consent will be deemed granted.

(v) In relation to any request for non standard hours, West Yorkshire Police retain the right to suggest any reasonable variation is promoting the prevention of crime and disorder objective.

- 17. There is responsible management of the premises.
- 18. Training and supervision of all staff.

- Best practice guide such as adhering to the BBPA, portman group on drinks strategy and other voluntary codes of practice.
- 20. Use of proof of age schemes.
- 21. There is the use of toughened glass and plastic glasses for outdoors, provision of litter bins and other security measures, such as lighting outside the premises.

Public safety

- 22. Before opening to the public, checks will be undertaken to ensure all access to the premises are clear for emergency vehicles. Regular checks will be undertaken when the premises is open.
- 23. Written records of all accidents and safety incidents involving members of the public will be kept. These will be made available at the request of an authorised officer.
- 24. Regular safety checks of the premises including decorative and functional fixtures, floor surfaces and equipment (including electrical appliances) to which the public may come into contact, must be undertaken. Records of these safety checks must be kept and made available for inspection by an authorised officer.
- 25. Regular safety checks of guardings to stairs, balconies, landings and ramps will be undertaken, and a supervision policy will be maintained to prevent people from inappropriate behaviour, including climbing which may lead to a fall from height.
- 26. Safety glass that is impact resistant or shielded to protect it from impact will be used in all areas where the public may come into contact with it.
- 27. Members of the public will be prevented from accessing hot food and drink preparation areas to prevent risk of scalds or burns to them.
- A suitably trained First Aider or appointed person will be provided at all times when the premises are open.
- 29. Adequate and appropriate First Aid equipment and materials will be available on the premises.
- 30. Where strobes, lasers, smoke machines or any other special effects equipment may be used, a written health and safety policy covering all aspects of their use will be provided, and staff will be appropriately trained.
- 31. No strobes, lasers or smoke machines will be used at the premises unless there is a clearly displayed warning at the entrance to the premises that such equipment is in use.
- Risk management assessment checked weekly and effective and responsible management will be undertaken at all times.
- Regular testing and certificate if appropriate of all procedures, appliances systems pertinent to safety.

The prevention of public nuisance

- Regular visits to all parts of the premises including the exterior and deliveries etc outside opening hours.
- 35. Management of people including staff and traffic arriving and leaving the premises liaison with public and private transport providers external lighting and security lighting installed.
- Collection and management of litter and effective ventilation systems to prevent nuisance from odour.

Protection of children from harm

- 37. The provision of sufficient staff to secure the protection of children from harm with appropriate training adoption of best practice.
- 38. Children will only be on the premises between 11am and 7pm.
- 39. No children to be in the bars during entertainment.
- 40. Children to be accompanied by adults at all times.
- 41. Proof of age scheme and or photo-id such as driving licence.

• 13 and replace with "The premises holder shall ensure that the premises are a member of any locally operating Pub Watch scheme."

• 14 and replace with "An approved proof of age scheme shall be adopted and implemented within the premise such as "Challenge 25" whereby an accepted form of photographic identification shall be requested before any alcohol is sold to any person who appears to be under 25 years of age. Acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customers photograph, date of birth and integral holographic mark or security measure. Suitable means of identification would include PASS approved proof of age card, photo-card driving licence and passport."

• 15 and replace with "A suitable CCTV system will be operational at the premises at all times when licensable activities are being carried out and at any other times where members of the public are present on the premises. The CCTV system will:

o cover all areas of the premises occupied by the public under the terms of the licence, including corridors and stairways (excluding WCs and changing rooms);

cover the main entrances, exits and designated emergency egress routes from the premises;
 will cover all external areas of the premises occupied by the public i.e. queuing areas, beer gardens, smoking areas and car parks;

contain the correct time and date stamp information and

o have sufficient storage retention capacity for a minimum of 31 days' continuous footage which will be of good quality."

• 18 and replace with "All staff are to be trained with respect to underage sales, such training to be updated as necessary when legislation changes and should include training in how to refuse sales to difficult customers"

• 21 and replace with "The premises licence holder shall ensure that all drinking glasses used within the premises are of toughened or safety glass to the appropriate safety standard, in that they shall not produce sharp shards when broken."






Cumulative Impact Policy



Area 5 relates to the Horsforth district of Leeds centred on Town Street. It includes all areas inside the green boundary, but also the premises on the south side of New Road Side.

It is the council's policy, on receipt of relevant representations, to refuse new and variation applications in Area 5 for licences for pubs, clubs, bars, café bars, restaurants and takeaways, unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application would not impact on the cumulative effect of such licensed premises in the area.

Rationale


Since the adoption of the Horsforth CIP the council has recognised that the accumulation of licensed premises along New Road Side has contributed to public nuisance in that area, especially as it encourages the use of a route through residential areas used by people moving from Town Street to New Road Side. As a consequence this area has been included in the cumulative impact area for Horsforth.

Horsforth has also experienced creep in licensed hours in the area. The council has noted that although it received no new applications for premises licences it did receive 8 variations in the same time period.


Concern has been expressed by residents about the litter nuisance and public nuisance caused by takeaway premises. The council has received a number of complaints relating to litter and odour nuisance that can be related to takeaway premises.


The above map shows the number and location of nuisance complaints received by Leeds City Council relevant to licensed premises in Area 4 since 2005.



As can be seen from the above maps, there is a concentration of nuisance reports, anti-social behaviour and violent crime in the areas dominated by licensed premises. The concentration is less pronounced with violent crime however, is still apparent in the area around Town Street.



As Fig 5 shows, there has been a very slight and gradual increase over the past 5 years with respect to the number of premises and latest terminal hour for premises in Area 5.

In real terms the numbers are very small and can be summarised as – 2 extra premises which close prior to midnight, and 1 extra premises each for the three following 1 hour time slots. Unlike Area 2, these are not premises which have, in effect, moved their hours later, but rather extra premises on top of what already existed.

While the actual numbers are small, this is to be expected as Area 5 is geographically a small area, where one premises can make a large difference.

Even with reduced numbers, the pattern of increased numbers of premises opening later is evident. Overall, Area 5 now has three more premises open beyond midnight than it did in 2005 (15% increase) – echoing the concerns of local residents that premises are very slowly increasing their hours by small increments.

NB: The above analysis includes the proposed area around New Road Side, as this is an area of concern for residents, and also is the focus of a good proportion of the nuisance complaints.





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

Thank you for submitting your application for the above premises, received at the address above on 4th September 2015.

The area in which the subject premises is located in within a cumulative impact area. It is the council's policy, on receipt of relevant representations, to refuse new and variation application in Area 4 for alcohol led premises, premises seeking late night refreshment and late opening restaurants unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application would not impact on the cumulative effect of such licensed premises in the area.

The cumulative impact policy was initially put in place to address concerns relating to disorder on Horsforth Town Street, and later extended due to public nuisance in the streets between Town Street and New Road Side. Local residents experienced nuisance from people who were intoxicated moving through the residential streets from Town Street to the takeaway premises on New Road Side, and also going home.

The Licensing Authority is concerned that extending licensed hours to 2am would push this disturbance back an hour into the night time which may not be tolerated by people living in the surrounding areas.

An additional concern is that no other licensed premises has licensed hours beyond 1am and this approval would set a precedent for a later usual closing time for Horsforth which would add to the cumulative impact of licensed premises in the area.

The Licensing Authority is of the opinion that your application contains insufficient information about how your application would not add to the impact already being experienced in the area.






