Between 01/01/2011 and 31/01/2013, three police records make specific reference to the Astons ginnel, these all relate to addresses on Aston Drive

Date	Event	Description (as recorded on WYP systems)
25/02/2011	Incident - Damage	Caller heard 2 bags - he looked out of the window and saw a lad running down the ginnel opposite his house with a shot gun in his hand., mtf, the male went off towards the withers estate - just one male on his own
05/03/2012	Crime – Damage	Attacked premises is semi detached house, at time and date stated suspects approach fence at rear of property which backs onto secluded ginnel. Suspects use bodily force to kick through fence pannel causing damage and gain entry to back garden
02/04/2012	Incident – ASB	Caller reporting nuisance bike who has been on footpath behind aston drive and down to raynville school., bike was heading from the school towards the aston drive and caller states will be in teh area., happened 5 mins ago.

Between 01/01/2011 and 31/01/2013, seven police records have details that suggest that the event occurred at, or was commissioned from the rear of the property, adjacent to the Aston's ginnel, although the ginnel itself may not have been a significant factor to the event.

Date	Event	Description (as recorded on WYP systems)
12/01/2011	Crime - Arson	Aston Drive Unknown suspects approach locus and using unknown means start fire in rear garden fence, which causes a 1x1 foot square hole in the fence. Suspects then make off from scene, nothing seen nor heard
28/01/2011	Crime - Burglary dwelling	Aston Drive Suspect/s rear of dwelling and gain entry by using bodily force against rear door. Once inside, suspect/s make untidy search of all rooms before selecting property and egressing as entry making off with same.
03/03/2011	Crime - Burglary dwelling	Aston Drive Person/s unknown approach rear of victims property and using jemmy or similar attempt to gain entry to property to no gain, make good escape unseen. No entry gained, damage only caused.
03/03/2011	Crime - Burglary dwelling	Aston Drive Suspect/s attend rear of property and force door using jemmy or similar, sash jammers snapped off during entry, once inside carry out untidy search, property removed, make good escape unseen.
28/08/2011	Crime - Burglary dwelling	Aston Drive Attacked property is a privately owned semi detached dwelling located in a residential area. Between times stated premises unoccupied when suspect/s unknown approach the rear of dwelling by walking through the front gates, down the drive and into a seclu
03/11/2012	Incident – ASB	Aston Drive Caller reporting a live band complete with amplifiers performing very loudly and very badly at locus, could hear it on phone, she has tried noise team but been on hold for 15 mins, for local npt awareness, the band is in the rear garden, call aware of wyp
04/11/2012	Crime – Damage	Aston Terrace Suspect/s unknown have thrown a large stone at lower rear window of dwelling colliding with the window causing it to smash. Suspects made off unseen.

Between 01/01/2011 and 31/01/2013, there were 11 locations with more than one incident recorded. Eight repeat locations were residential properties, mostly with domestic violence incidents or ongoing disputes linked to them, and as such proximity to the ginnel is unlikely to be a factor. One residential address has five repeat events, two domestic burglaries and three incidents of damage to fencing, one of these events has been specifically linked to the ginnel.

Abandoned vehicles

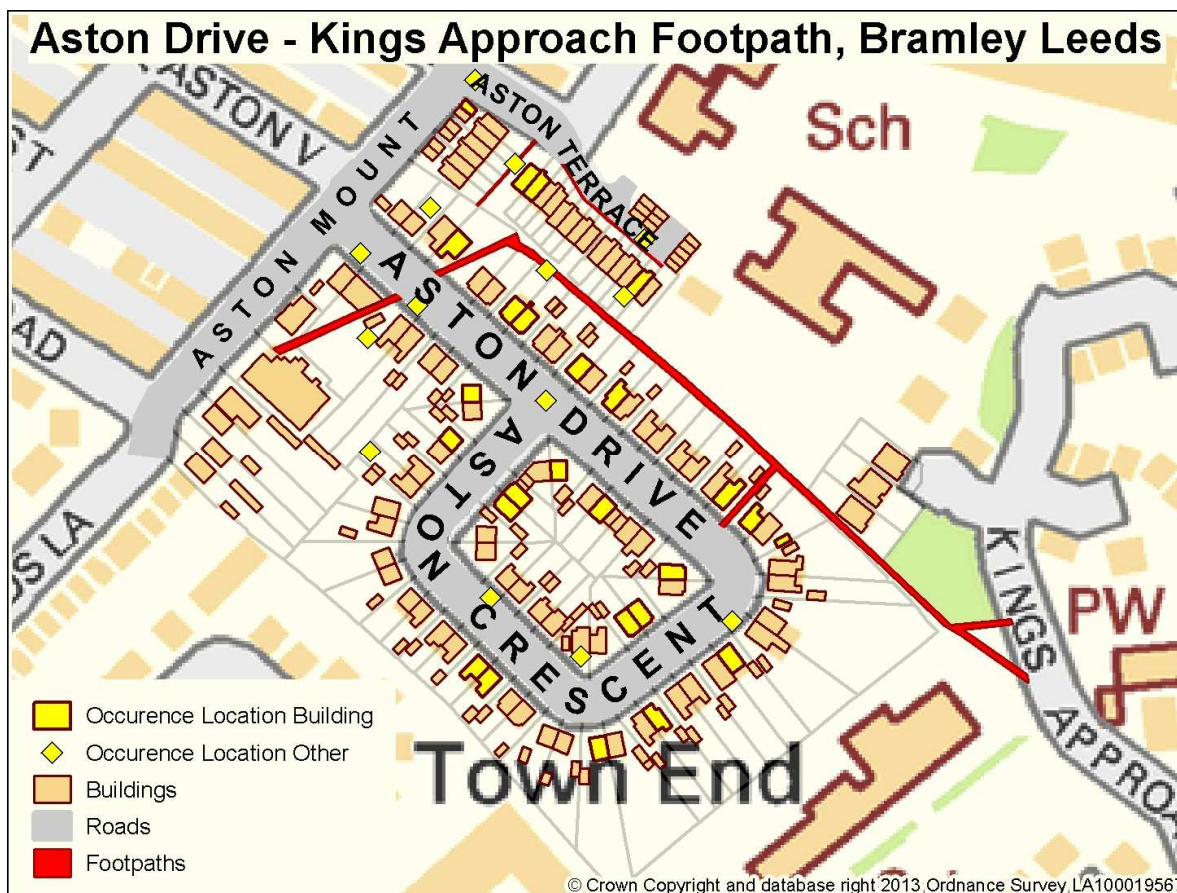
Aston Crescent

Vehicle nuisance, mopeds and cars repeatedly driven up and down, possibly delivering drugs
Damage to parked vehicles
Abandoned vehicles
Suspicious behaviour
Parking disputes associated with the school run

A number of reports indicate persons being seen running off from the vicinity in the direction of Houghley Gill, it is possible that vehicles may be being abandoned on Aston Drive, Aston Crescent and Aston Terrace by perpetrators who then use the ginnel to return on foot, via Houghley Gill, to the Raynvilles/Wythers area.
