

### ***Evaluation of Leeds Challenges Hate Crime Event 3<sup>rd</sup> Dec***

We asked attendees to answer a number of questions to enable us to evaluate the effectiveness of the event. Out of 72 people that attended we had 41 who completed an evaluation form. The results are as follows

#### ***1. The event met my expectations.***

*97% said that the event had met their expectations.*

#### ***2. I now understand what Hate Crime is***

96% said that they now understood what Hate Crime was.

#### ***3. I would feel confident in reporting an incident of Hate Crime***

95% said they would feel confident in reporting an incident of Hate Crime.

#### ***4. I know where to go to report Hate Crime***

93% said they would now know where to go in order to report a Hate Crime

#### ***5. The speakers were informative.***

*98% said the speakers were informative on the subject.*

#### ***6. How do you rate the event overall?***

*Over half of the attendees told us that the event was excellent.*

#### ***Additional Comments for consideration from feedback forms were***

***Next Steps:***

In 2014 we are continuing to challenge hate crime in Leeds by mystery shopping our hate crime reporting centres (including housing offices), carrying out training and working closely with the Police, LASBT and Stop Hate UK.

Suggested that in order to increase tenant representation at event to think about holding smaller scale sessions in the community to raise awareness of hate crime.

We are in process of training all housing offices in West, North West by mid-February. We are also looking at holding a training event for tenants in March.
