2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

Leeds City Council has a contract in place with Connect Housing to provide two floating support services for older and disabled people. This contract forms part of the programme of Housing Related Support services commissioned by Strategy and Commissioning, Public Health on behalf of Environment and Housing Directorate.

The current contract is due to expire on 30th September 2014 and approval is being sought to enter into the 12 month extension period available within the contract. The cost of this extension period will be £91,546.72 per annum. The extension is required to ensure continuity of service whilst a review of floating support services for older and disabled people is completed to determine future commissioning requirements.

A detailed review of the remaining commissioned housing related support services for older and disabled people is currently being undertaken by officers in Public

Health. .

Decommissioning the services at this time is not an option as it would leave vulnerable clients without the support they need to maintain independent living and could impact negatively on health and social care services.

Approval to extend the contract will ensure continuity of existing services, and therefore there will be no change to the support provided to people who are in receipt of the service. A detailed Equality Impact Assessment (EIA) will be undertaken as part of the review to help identify where there are gaps in services and issues for particular equality groups. The EIA will be used to inform the design and future commissioning of housing related support for these client groups.
