Key considerations/guidance for a future reserve matters application if you like.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Amend as follows: "An area of land to the east of Oulton Village was designated as a Protected Area of Search (PAS) for development in the Leeds Unitary Development Plan (UDP Policy N34). The purpose of this designation is to provide land and flexibility for the city's long-term development needs. An outline application to develop the land was approved in 2013. The site is approximately 3 hectares of agricultural land situated between Oulton Conservation Area to the east and Green Belt to the west, and between Fleet Lane to the north and Oulton Beck and the boundary of the Area of Special Landscape Value to the south. A public right of way footpath through the site links Farrer Lane with the Leeds Country Way and Trans Pennine Trail. The site is visible from within the Oulton Conservation Area and the design of any development should be carried out in close consultation with the local community and should respect the quality of the conservation Area Appraisal and within this Design Statement. Building forms, massing and heights will therefore need careful consideration to ensure
