





2013-14, Key Stage 1 - Percentage of year 1 pupils meeting the required standard of Phonic Decoding - FSM

Key Issues: 60 per cent of all children who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) achieved the required standard of phonic decoding, which is 1 percentage point below the national figure. The gap between FSM entitled pupils and non FSM entitled pupils in Leeds is 17 percentage points. Leeds' performance for this indicator increased by four percentage points between 2013 and 2014.









Key Issues: 68 per cent of pupils who speak English as an additional language (EAL) achieved the required standard of phonic decoding compared to the national figure of 74 per cent, creating a six per cent gapi in 2014. The gap between Leeds children who have EAL and those that don't is eight percentage points.





Key Issues: Pupils in Leeds who have SEN perform better than pupils nationally if they are in the School Action or School Action Plus groups,43 per cent of Leeds School Action Plus children achieved the required standard of phonic decoding performing 4 percentage points higher than the national figure of 39 per cent. 44 per cent of School Action children performed to the required standard, performing three percentage points higher than the national figure of 41 per cent. The gap between Leeds and the national average has reduced since 2013 for these groups. Statemented pupils in Leeds performed less well than nationally.






2013-14, Key Stage 2 - Percentage of pupils making expected progress between key stage 1 and key stage 2 - Writing







Key Issues: Performance of all pupil groups is considerably lower than the corresponding national figure except for Chinese pupils who are 2 percentage points above the national figure. Chinese pupils in Leeds perform better than White/Mixed/Black pupils (16 percentage points) and Asian pupils (14 percentage points).
