Thank you for submitting your application for the above premises, received at the above address on 18th June 2015.

West Yorkshire Police are of the opinion that your application contains insufficient information about how you intend to meet the licensing objectives.

We therefore confirm that we are submitting a formal representation against your application on the grounds of-:

- 1. the prevention of crime & disorder
- 2. public safety

However, we are of the opinion that the licensing objectives could be met should you be prepared to incorporate certain identified measures within your operating schedule as conditions.

Please find enclosed a document which at **Part 1** contains the suggested measures which this authority considers are proportionate and appropriate to the nature of your application – the application being for a

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café/bar with open kitchen with all day dining and entertainment, operating until midnight Sunday to Thursday, and 01:00hrs Friday and Saturday.

Should you be in agreement with the suggested measures then please signify this by completing and signing **Part 2** of the enclosed form and return the complete document to this office as soon as possible. Upon receipt of your consent at **Part 2**, it will be taken that you signify your wishes for the licensing authority to amend your operating schedule to incorporate the proposed measures as conditions along with those you have already offered.

Alternatively should you disagree with the proposed measures, then please complete **Part 3** and again return the complete document to this office as soon as possible.

Dear Cath

Thank you for your qualified objection. I have now had the opportunity to take my clients instructions.

The premises will operate as a discreet operation independent to The Hop and the Candle Bar which my client operates in the immediate vicinity. There will be a different style of operation with the premises being chameleon in focus.

The premises will serve breakfasts in a morning to catch the commuter traffic once the South station entrance is open. They will then change the food focus during the day until in to the evening and will have a mix of drinks and beers available. Food will be a key component part throughout the operation of the premises during the day and evening.

There will be musical entertainment (but no live bands).

They are happy to offer the following conditions which we hope you find appropriate:-

- A minimum number of seats will be offered between 12.00 hours and 21.00 hours at the number of 75 internal seats and 20 external seats.
- In relation to door supervision our client would be amenable to amending the condition to read "On Fridays and Saturdays a minimum of one door staff shall be deployed from 23.00 hours until close of business". They have operated two units on Granary Wharf for a significant period and tell me that the Bank Holiday weekends are a washout as there are no people around. They have not ever been required to have a door supervisor at The Hop premises on Bank Holiday weekends nor at the Candle Bar since it has opened. In the circumstances they would ask that they could risk assess Bank Holiday weekends themselves and would be more happy to place door supervisors on a Bank Holiday weekend if there is a specific event in the area or if the use of the area at Bank Holiday weekends changes from its current very quiet status.

I hope in the circumstances this meets the concerns that have been raised and look forward to hearing from you.
