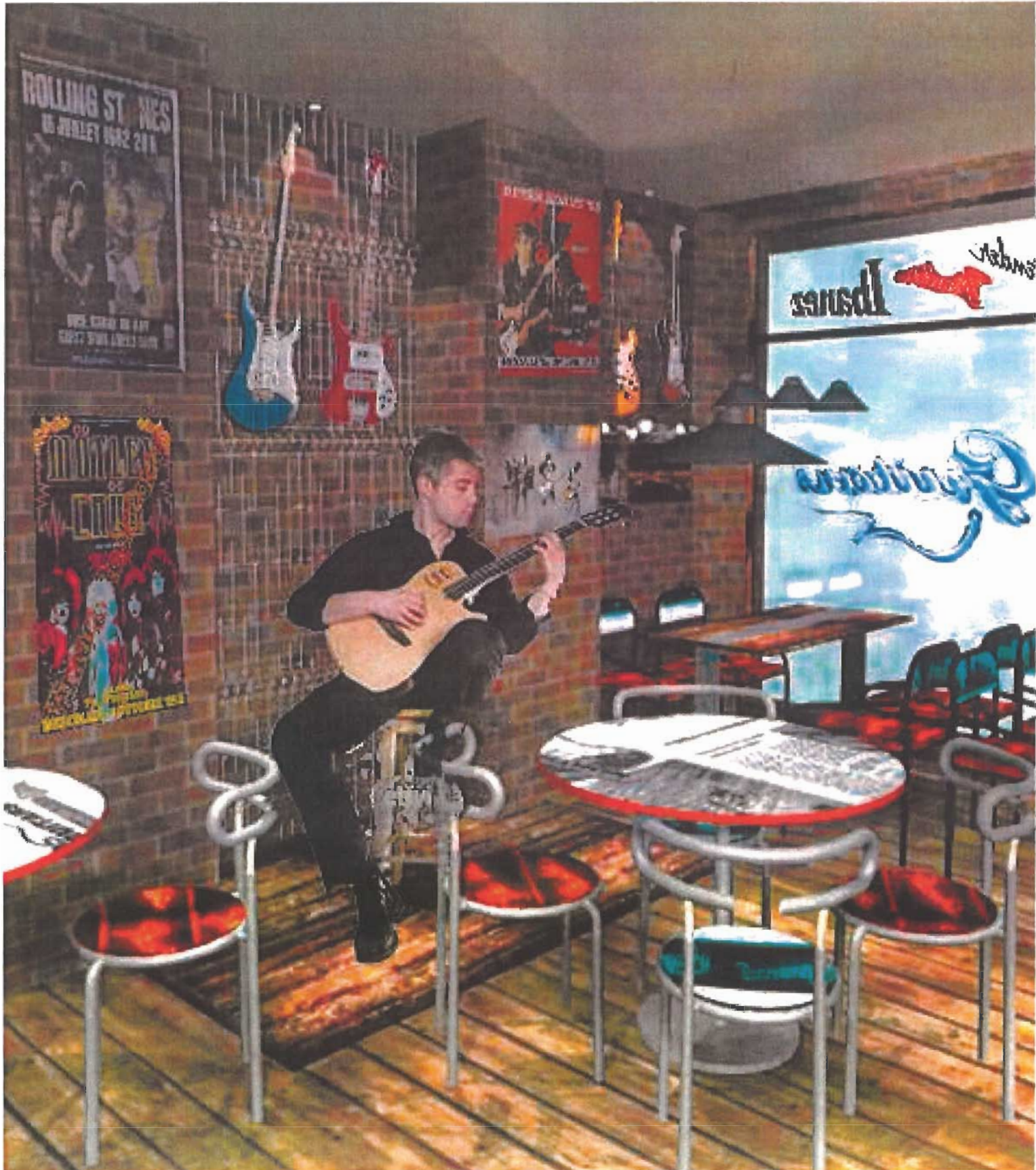

Aim

- To safeguard the future of Northern Guitars business by supplemental income from integral café bar offering.
- To attract more musicians and touring bands to the guitar shop by enhancing the retail experience.
- To generate new business from non musicians via food and drink sales.

Currently

- The only independent retail guitar shop in Leeds.
- The only surviving retail shop of any kind on Call Lane.



Proposal



Mock-up of interior

- The retail guitar shop to be moved to the first floor; the ground floor as a guitar show room retaining string and accessory sales with cafe seating and tables.
- Food will be 'Yorkshire street food', pie and peas, stew, burgers with vegetarian options. This will be prepared fresh daily and will be served at the table.
- There will be a fresh coffee machine, tea and cake.
- Alcoholic drink will focus on local bottled craft ales and premium bottled beers from around the world, with the aim to provide draught ales from local micro breweries. Food and drinks will be served at the table.

- The window display of guitars is to be retained with additional guitars hung on the walls.
- The service counter will be designed to resemble a row of guitar speaker cabinets. Guitar strings and accessories will be for sale from a display behind the counter.
- The decor will feature photographic work from local artist Neil Chapman a trustee of the Leeds Music Trust with these profits going to the Leeds Music Trust charity. Other music related art will be exhibited on the walls.
- We intend to showcase local acoustic musicians playing on selected evenings and weekends.

Summary

We intend to capitalise on the reputation of the independent guitar shop we have run since 1989. During this time we have sold over 10,000 guitars and have become internationally respected. Notable musicians that have visited the shop include Status Quo, Noel Gallagher, Kaiser Chiefs, Motorhead, Saxon, Hawkwind, Imelda May band as well as many international touring bands.

We are the last remaining retail business on Call Lane and with the addition of the Guitar themed cafe/bar we wish to maintain Leeds' position as a cultural, shopping and music centre.

By incorporating a cafe environment we feel this will give us a distinctive edge to move the guitar business forward.

The cafe will feature jazz/blues/country rock aimed at an over 30s crowd which we see as an extension of the guitar retail business. We specifically do not want a young clientele of stag parties and the like and instead would very much look to complement the clientele visiting our neighbours Arts Café and Rolands.

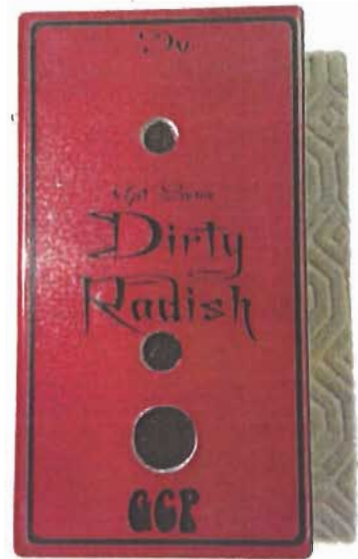

Old Chapel Music Studios is Leeds' longest running music rehearsal studio business, established in 1982 as Parkside Studios in Armley and in 1992 moving to the The Old Chapel at Czar Street, Holbeck.

We recently expanded to offer a classroom, recording studio, guitar repairs and music education through Leeds Music Trust and Cloth Cat Studios.

We have always tried to nurture young talent in the city and in 2009 we set up Leeds Music Trust as a registered charity with the help of Leeds' most successful band, Kaiser Chiefs to help disadvantaged groups and communities access the same facilities and support networks as the established Leeds music scene. The charity now owns and runs the studios which operates as a Community Interest Company.

We have had an excellent relationship with Northern Guitars since they opened in the late 1980s, and with [REDACTED] in particular as he has been very willing to assist aspiring musicians, sourcing quality instruments and giving good honest advice. Kaiser Chiefs were just one among thousands of bands that have been helped along the way by this gem of a shop in the heart of the city.

I have no doubt the business would benefit from this application and give it a new lease of life in difficult times, adding a different and more mature venue to the area. Many of Leeds' established bands are excited to have a relaxed venue still centred around music making and instruments. We have discussed with [REDACTED] the idea of adding to that feel by assisting with the photographic music art gallery, sales from which would feed back into Leeds Music Trust to support more aspiring local musicians.

Both Old Chapel Music as a business and Leeds Music Trust as a charity would endorse the application to allow food and drink sales and develop the trade at the shop at it's current site, which has a good well established reputation for honest trade and support of the local music scene.

Having been a publican and a concert promoter in Leeds for over 38 years, I can see the advantage of a cafe/bar dedicated to musicians and the like. To my knowledge, many national and international 'names' have visited Northern Guitars... I've pointed a few of them in that direction myself.

A small bar, where people in the music business can get together to exchange ideas and talk about their equipment requirements over a coffee or a beer, appears to be a good idea, and it could be of benefit to the image of Leeds as a progressive city.

Northern Guitars was established on Call Lane over 25 years ago, long before the area came alive with the recent bars and eating establishments. When the guitar shop initially opened, there were two other musical instrument retail outlets on Call Lane; it was the 'go to' area for musicians. Because of the influx of bars replacing those retail outlets, it's reasonable to assume that not as many people are attracted to Call Lane to buy instruments. In order to survive, it's essential for Northern Guitars to move onwards.

At a time when most people are buying online, it looks like a dedicated bar, with a retail unit on the upper floor, would be a positive step to help keep this established business afloat.

I have been a customer of Northern guitar for many years and I have always appreciated their knowledge and effort in their approach to how they run their music store. I am a music industry tour manager and through my work I have travelled the world many times. I also own a music equipment rental company which hires equipment to many international acts so I know what my clients like and what their tastes are like. As I am based in Birstal i often end up taking bands down to Northern guitars to look at their interesting stock as it is totally different to any other music store in the area.

Over the past few months Dave has been talking about his idea to open his store with a fresh new look and with options to bring in new clientele by offering a cafe type environment and service. I have seen this idea work in many major US cities and i feel his idea could work by offering a service to many different groups of musicians. Having the ability to sit and have a coffee while you look at instruments would work for me!

I feel his idea would attract a more mature type of client who when purchasing higher end instrument they would feel more comfortable and relaxed when viewing and examining more expensive instruments.

Over the last few years I have seen the demise of the music store in Leeds and if there are no new stores opening there will be a knock on effect for the live music scene as well. 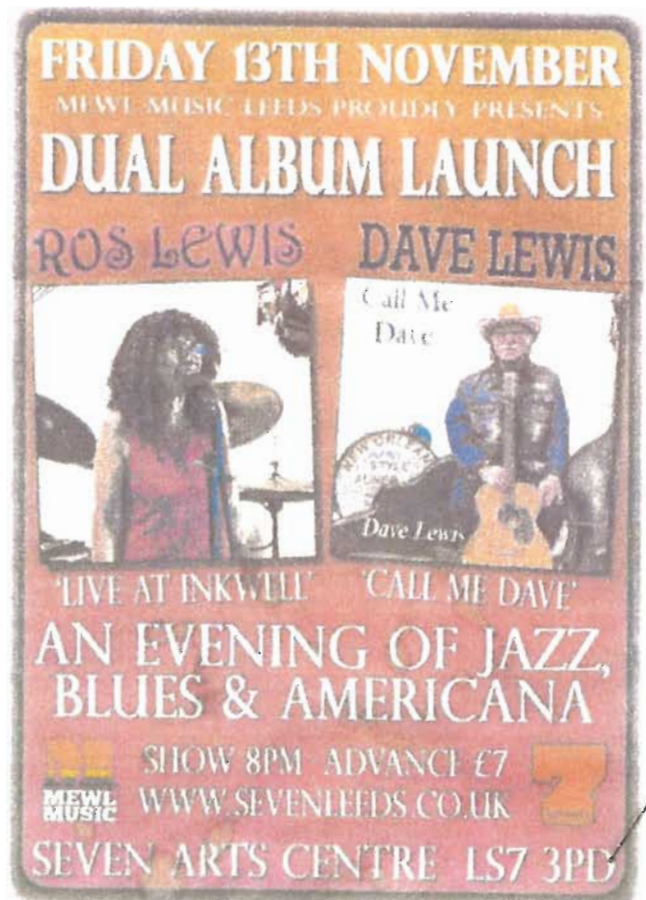

It was around this time (90 to 91) that i first became aware of Northern Guitars and was immediately struck by the difference between them and other "chain" music stores. Northern Guitars was somewhere you could buy , trade and sell instruments , somewhere to meet other musicians , somewhere to go for advice or just to hang out and play some tunes .

In more recent times i have been saddened to see the business falling off somewhat , due to all other retail units on call lane becoming bars as far as i can see

Ref Northern Guitar Centre planned Café business.

Having been a musician for some 25 years Northern Guitar Centre has been a regular haunt of mine. It's a fantastic shop run by enthusiasts.

Its increasingly rare for an independent music retailer to exist, especially in a large city centre environment like Leeds.

As the larger national retailers squeeze margins ever tighter, and online sales bite I would imagine its very tough to maintain the business as a profitable concern.

I think the idea for them to diversify their business into a café combined with retail sales is fantastic.

Not only is the viability of the business likely to be secured (meaning Leeds does not lose one of its favourite and unique shops) but the additional footfall through the premises is sure to inspire and nurture the local music scene.

Live music is a wonderful thing, to see it being driven further away from the city centre by increasing numbers of "club" bars and food outlets has been a real concern over recent years. Too many small venues closing and nothing replaces them. To have a location where live music and performance is a priority, combined with advice and rotating varied retail stock would be a wonderful thing for the live music fans and performers in the area.

New Guitar Café plans hope to strike a chord

MUSIC FANS in Leeds have been somewhat deprived of cool places to socialise recently.

With The Cockpit gone, Fab Café closed and Carpe Diem shutting for good last month, the city centre is rapidly running out of alternative live music venues.

But that could be about to change.

Plans are underway to create a new Guitar Café on Call Lane, complete with a guitar shop, guitar-themed café and bar area and a stage.

The idea is to give local musicians a place to perform and socialise with other like-minded music fans.

Northern Guitars is behind the concept, and hopes to adapt their shop on Call Lane for the project.

The shop has been there for more than 25 years and has proved hugely popular - gaining fans as far away as New Zealand.

Speaking to City Buzz, owner Dave Baguley said: "This would be a unique type of venue."

"We aim to be a café/bar/guitar shop run by musicians for musicians, with good food and craft beers in a relaxed atmosphere - not for the party crowd."

There are plans for a small food menu, as well as coffee, cakes and craft beer.

Dave believes there's very much a market for it, and told City Buzz that when bands come to the city to perform, many of them make time to stop by the shop.

"Guitars and bands are a lifestyle," he says.

"We have been in the music business all our working lives in various ways."

"With the new arena and the O2, we get the touring bands calling in looking at guitars and this would be a cool, relaxing place for them to hang out."

Members of Status Quo have visited Northern Guitars in the past, and the business has sold over 10,000 guitars since it launched.

He added: "Over the years many great bands have formed from meetings in cafés and bars."

"We have done our market research, spoken with our customers, local promoters, studios and other people in the music business who all think it's a unique idea."

Explaining why he feels a change is needed, he said: "We have been selling guitars successfully on Call Lane for

25 years as an independent retailer and we want to move with the times.

"A café/bar would complement the guitar shop and the other music bars on the lane."

He added: "I could go on for hours about what we want to do. Guitars and music are our passion."

The shop has seen a lot of change over the 25 years. When it opened, most of the businesses on the street were retailers - and three of them were guitar shops.

However, it's stood the test of time and managed to stick it out through the recession.

But it now finds itself surrounded by bars and clubs and is the only shop still standing.

Being a daytime retailer surrounded by what is now predominantly a night-time trade must be tough, and the fact they have survived amongst all this change speaks volumes.

It's good to see independent businesses take some initiative and expand their offering. We wish them the best of luck.
