Summary of main issues

- 1. At the Scrutiny Board meeting in November 2015, the Board considered an outline of information from NHS England and Leeds' Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) regarding the potential future arrangements for commissioning primary care services. At the Board meeting in December 2015, members gave more formal consideration to the details provided, specifically in relation to governance issues and managing conflicts of interest.
- 2. The key areas of discussion at the December meeting included:
 - The role of CCGs in Leeds, particularly in terms of its response to a diverse range of health needs and engagement with local GP practices.
 - An update on patient engagement work and patient leader training.
 - The role of lay members on the CCG Board.
 - The financial responsibilities of CCGs and making best use of available resources.
 - The role of the Scrutiny Board in holding to account the work of CCGs.
 - A recommendation that Community Committee Health and Wellbeing Champions be included in the membership of the proposed Primary Care Committees.
