


Key Issues: In Leeds the percentage of children achieving a good level of development on free school meals has increased by six percentage points, although this is still behind national performance the gap is closing. The gap between FSM eligible and non FSM is 22 percentage points in Leeds compared to 18 percentage points nationally.

2014-15, EYFS - Percentage of pupils achieving a Good Level Of Development - English as an additional language (EAL)




Key Issues: In Leeds the percentage of EAL achieving a good level of development has increased by 19 percentage points and the gap between Leeds EAL and national EAL is five percentage points. The gap between Leeds EAL and non-EAL is 16 percentage points compared to a gap of 8 percentage points nationally.







Key Issues: Girls in Leeds are out performing boys by 16 percentage points which mirrors the national trend where the gap is 15 percentage points. Performance of boys in Leeds is five percentage point below performance nationally and girls' performance in Leeds is four percentage point behind the national figure.
