



2014-15, Key Stage 2 - Percentage of pupils achieving level 4 or above - Maths



















2014-15, Key Stage 2 - Percentage of pupils making expected progress between key stage 1 and key stage 2 - Maths










Key Issues: Over half (60 per cent) of all children who are eligible for FSM achieved level 4 or above in Reading, Writing and Maths in Leeds compared to 82 per cent of children who aren't eligible. This represents a gap of 22 percentage points compared to the national gap of 17 percentage points. Nationally, 66 per cent of children who are eligible for FSM achieve the benchmark.






Key Issues: In Leeds performance improved across all groups except for black pupils where the percentage achieving reading, writing and maths at level 4 plus fell slightly by one percentage point. Performance across all groups is lower than the corresponding national figure except for Chinese pupils who are above the national figure by two percentage points. In Leeds the percentage of pupils achieving the standard is higher amongst Chinese, White and Mixed pupils compared to Black and Asian pupils.








2014-15, Key Stage 2 - Percentage of pupils achieving level 4 or above in Reading, Writing and Maths - Gender










Key Issues: In Leeds attainment in reading, writing and mathematics combined has improved for both boys (three percentage points) and girls (one percentage point) which mirrors a national trend. Girls in Leeds continue to out perform boys in Leeds creating a gap of four percentage points. Performance in Leeds is below the national average by three percentage points for girls and two percentage points for boys.



2014-15, Key Stage 2 - Percentage of pupils achieving level 4 or above in Grammar, punctuation and spelling - FSM












2014-15, Key Stage 2 - Percentage of pupils achieving level 4 or above in Grammar, punctuation and spelling - Gender









Key Issues: Girls in Leeds continue to out perform boys in Leeds in level 4 plus grammar, punctuation and spelling which mirrors a national trend. Performance in Leeds remains below the national average with a gap of two per cent points between Leeds and national girls and a one percentage point difference between Leeds and national boys.
