Summary of main issues

- 1. Since 2012 Chive Fuels have supplied liquefied natural gas under contract LCC5306.
- 2. The contact was for a 2 year period with the option to extend 2 x 12 months.
- 3. All extension periods have now been taken and the contract ends on the 16th December 2016.
- 4. Approval is sought from the Chief Officer, CEL, for Fleet Services to commence a procurement exercise for the supply of liquefied fuel.
- 5. A project is underway for a dedicated fast fill gas station running off a high pressure main gas line to be built in the Crossgreen area but due to delays this is not expected to be commissioned until 2018 at the earliest.
- 6. The new contract will be for 18 months with the option to extend up to 30 months due to the unknown timescale for the new dedicated high pressure main gas station commissioning date.
- 7. The expected spend will be £100,000 per annum.

Recommendations

The Chief Officer, CEL, is recommended to approve the request to commence a procurement exercise for the supply of liquefied fuel for 18 months with the option to extend up to 30 months from the 17th December 2017.

Purpose of this report

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek approval to commence a procurement exercise for the supply of liquefied fuel.

2 Background information

- **2.2** Since 2012 Chive Fuels have supplied liquefied natural gas under contract LCC5306.
- **2.3** The contact was for a 2 year period with the option to extend 2 x 12 months.
- **2.4** The contract now has to be re-tendered as the contract ends on the 16th December 2016
- **2.5** A project is underway for a dedicated fast fill gas station running off a high pressure main gas line to be built in the Crossgreen area but due to delays this is not expected to be commissioned until 2018 at the earliest.
- **2.6** The new contract will be for 18 months with the option to extend up 30 months due to the unknown timescale for the new dedicated high pressure main gas station commissioning date.

3 Main issues

3.1 The contract for the supply of liquefied fuel is essential for supplying the liquid gas storage tank at the Refuse Collection Depot, Crossgreen Industrial Estate. The fuel is used by major service users and is essential for the operation of dedicated CNG refuse fleet vehicles and dedicated CNG vans to carry out front line services such as refuse collection and housing repairs.

3.2 Corporate Considerations

3.1 Consultation and Engagement

3.1.1 The decision to re-tender the contract has been discussed with Procurement and Refuse Collection.

3.2 Equality and Diversity / Cohesion and Integration

3.5.1 Contract Procedures allows the contracts to be re-tendered before the expiry date of the 16th December 2016.

3.6 Risk Management

3.6.1 Not carrying out a contract renewal would leave the Council with no fuel supplier and at risk of major front line service failure.

4 Conclusions

Since 2012 Chive Fuels have supplied liquefied natural gas under contract LCC5306.

The contact was for a 2 year period with the option to extend 2 x 12 months.

The contract now has to be re-tendered as the contract ends on the 16th December 2016.

Approval is sought from the Chief Officer, CEL, for Fleet Services to commence a procurement exercise for the supply of liquefied fuel.

Recommendations

4.1 The Chief Officer CEL is recommended to approve the request to commence a procurement exercise for the supply of liquefied fuel for an 18 month contract with the option to extend for 30 months commencing the 17th December 2016.
