

### Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

- 1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
  - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
  - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
  - c. damage
- 2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

- a. games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage individuals to
  - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee other public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other think as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorize anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- e. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date or birth and either -

- a. a holographic mark, or
- b. an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person must ensure that
  - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
    - i. beer or cider:  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint;
    - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - iii. still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - b. these measures are displayed in a menu; price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol c. to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 8. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 of this condition -

- "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; a.
- b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$  where i.
  - P is the permitted price,
  - D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty ii. were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the iii. value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - i. the holder of the premises licence,
  - the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or ii.
  - the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under iii. such a licence;
- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- "value added tax" mean value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added e. Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Embedded restrictions**

- 9. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours stated on this licence and:
  - a. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
  - b. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- 10. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
  - a. the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first thirty minutes after above hours;
  - b. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals.
  - c. consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
  - d. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
  - e. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
  - f. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
  - g. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
  - h. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
  - i. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- 11. Where the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 the licensee shall ensure that the provisions of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 are complied with.

## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

#### The prevention of crime and disorder

- 12. A suitable CCTV system will be maintained and be operational on the premises at all times when licensed activities are being carried out.
- 13. CCTV security footage will be made secure and retained for a minimum period of 31 days time to the satisfaction of WYP;
- 14. A Supervisor's Register will be maintained at the licensed premises, showing the names, addresses and up to date contact details for the DPS and all personal licence holders.
- 15. The Supervisors Register will state the name of the person who is in overall charge of the premises et each time that licensed activities are carried out, and this information will be retained for a period of twelve months and produced for inspection on request to an authorised officer;
- 16. The PLH/DPS will ensure that an Incident Report Register is maintained on the premises to record incidents such as anti social behaviour, admissions refusals and ejections from the premises.
- 17. The Incident Report Register will contain consecutively numbered pages, the date, time and location of the incident, details of the nature of the incident, the names and registration numbers of any door staff involved or to whom the incident was reported, the names and numbers of any police officers attending, the police incident and or/ crime number, names and addresses of any witnesses and confirmation of whether there is CCTV footage of the incident.
- 18. The Incident Report Register will be produced for inspection immediately on the request of an authorised officer.
- 19. The PLH/DPS and all members of staff will ask for proof of age from any person appearing to be under the age of 21 who attempts to purchase alcohol at the premises.
- 20. The PLH/DPS will belong to a recognised trade body or Pub Watch scheme where one exists, whose aims include the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 21. Drinks, open bottles and glasses will not be taken from the premises after 23:00 hours. Empty bottles and glasses will be collected regularly and promptly. Glass and other sharp objects will be stored and disposed of safely using suitable receptacles. Receptacles will be secured and not accessible to the customers.

### The prevention of public nuisance

- 22. The activities of persons using the external areas shall be monitored after 23:00hrs and they shall be reminded to have regard to the needs of local residents and to refrain from shouting and anti social behaviour etc when necessary.
- 23. Licensable activities shall be conducted and the facilities for licensed activities shall be designed and operated so as to prevent the transmission of audible noise or perceptible vibration through the fabric of the building or structure to adjoining properties.
- 24. Noise from a licensable activity at the premises shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises after 11pm and at all if entertainment takes place on more than 30 occasions per year.
- 25. Bottles will not be placed in any external receptacle after 11pm to minimise noise disturbance to neighbouring properties.

- 26. Noise from plant or machinery shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant or machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
- 27. The designated premises supervisor and any door supervisors will monitor the activity of persons leaving the premises and remind them of their public responsibilities where necessary.
- 28. A facility will be provided for customers to order hackney taxis/private hire vehicles. Telephone numbers for taxi firms/private hire companies will be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.
