2016/17 Traffic Management Capital Programme - Appendix B

Site 1: Weetwood Ward TRO

The Issues:

Elected Ward Members and local residents have over the last few years requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking at several locations within the Weetwood ward.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £16,000, comprising of £9,500 works, £5,000 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce waiting restrictions at the following locations within the Weetwood ward and any other locations identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified;

- Bentley Grove & Bentley Lane
- Cottage Road
- Tinshill Lane
- Clayton Woods
- Glebelands Drive
- Spen Lane (CO-OP)
- Gordon View & Terrace
- B6157 Shaw Lane

Recommendations:

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £16,000, comprising of £9,500 works, £5,000 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order in the Weetwood ward.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Orders as advertised.

Site 2: Otley Old Road – Service Road, Weetwood

The Issues:

Elected Ward Members and local residents have over the last few years requested traffic management intervention in the form of Movement and Traffic Regulation Orders to easy traffic flow and remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking Otley Old road – Service Road.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £14,000 (£7,000 from Traffic Management Capital and £7,000 from Weetwood Ward Members), comprising of £9,000 works, £4,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Movement Order and a Traffic Regulation Order on Otley Old Road Service, Weetwood and any other roads identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified.

Recommendations:

- Give authority to incur match funded expenditure of £14,000, comprising of £9,000 works, £4,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order and a Movement Order in the Weetwood ward.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order and Movement Order to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Orders as advertised.

Site 3: Call Lane, Leeds

The Issues:

Concerns relating to road safety in the Call Lane area during the night time periods were brought to the attention of officer several years ago and interim arrangement have been introduced to create a safer road environment during the night time economy periods. As part of an ongoing review it is evident that the carriageway and footway provision is disproportionate for the usage. In the interest of public safety and to enhance the street environment it is proposed to widen the footways to facilitate the heavy pedestrian demands and to narrow the carriageway to reduce vehicular speeds and make the area less car dominant. In order to facilitate this desire there is a need to remove 4 pay and display bays which will be relocated elsewhere within the City as part of a separate parking review. Also proposed is the introduction of two raised speed tables, subject to consultation support.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £75,000 (£50,000 from Traffic Management Capital and £25,000 from LTP), comprising of £65,000 works, £8,500 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a road safety scheme to widen the footways, provision of two raised speed tables and the removal of the on street parking provision on Call Lane between the Corn Exchange and The Calls.

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £75,000, comprising of £65,000 works, £8,500 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a road safety scheme on Call Lane between the Corn Exchange and The Calls.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a notice under the provisions of Section 90c of the Highways Act 1980 to introduce vertical traffic calming features

 Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order and if no valid objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Order as advertised.

Site 4: PARKMAP – Movement Order software

The Issues:

Following the successful installation of PARKMAP and the computerisation of all Traffic Regulation Orders (waiting restrictions) in the Leeds District the next objective of the Authority is to provide a clear and transparent computerised system for all Movement and Speed Limit orders within the District that the general public can access.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £8,000 for the purchase and installation of the additional PARKMAP software to facilitate the computerisation of all Movement and Speed Limit Orders in the Leeds District.

Recommendations:

Give authority to incur expenditure of £8,000 for the purchase and installation
of the additional PARKMAP software to facilitate the computerisation of all
Movement and Speed Limit Orders.

Site 5: Holbeck & Southbank Area, Leeds

The Issues:

Concerns have been raised by Ward Members, businesses and local residents groups about the level of commuter parking which restricts parking opportunity for local needs. In some locations this parking creates obstructions within the Holbeck and Southbank areas, which removes the ability for a residents and business short stay parking opportunity. In order to resolve the concerns and improve parking provision for the general public and local businesses it is proposed to review the existing parking restrictions in the Holbeck and Southbank areas to provide on street parking provision relative to the current development and residential needs

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £25,000, comprising of £16,000 works, £7,500 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to review the existing waiting restrictions and promote a Traffic Regulation Order in the Holbeck and Southbank areas of Leeds.

Recommendations:

 Give authority to incur expenditure of £25,000, comprising of £16,000 works, £7,500 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to review the existing waiting restrictions and promote a Traffic Regulation Order to limited waiting, permit parking and no waiting at any time restrictions within the Holbeck and Southbank areas of Leeds. Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order to formalise the parking and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Orders as advertised.

Site 6: Hyde Park Road, Hyde Park

The Issues:

A local ward member has raised road safety concerns regarding indiscriminate and obstructive parking, which prevents and prohibits the free two way flow of traffic on Hyde Park Road, which has resulted in previous Police action. In order to resolve these concerns, improve the flow of traffic and remove the obstructive and indiscriminative parking, it is proposed to introduce a one way traffic flow and associated waiting restrictions.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £12,000, comprising of £7,500 works, £3,000 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a Movement Order for the one-way traffic flow and a Traffic Regulation Order for the associated waiting restrictions on Hyde Park Road.

Recommendations:

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £12,000, comprising of £7,500 works, £3,000 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order and a Movement Order in the Weetwood ward.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order and Movement Order to improve traffic flow and remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Orders as advertised.

Site 7: Lane End Place, Leeds

The Issues:

Road safety concerns have been raised by local residents and the local schools about the lack of a footway link along the western side Lane End Place from the M621pedestrian underpass to Beeston Road and the adjacent schools. In order to resolve the concerns and improve the provision for pedestrians it is proposed to provide a footway along the western side of Lane End Place to provide a continuous and safe link from the M621 pedestrian underpass and the local schools.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £17,000, comprising of £12,000 works and £5,000 staff to promote a road safety scheme to provide a footway along the western side of Lane End Place between motorway underpass and Beeston Road.

 Give authority to incur expenditure of £17,000, comprising of £12,000 works and £5,000 staff, to promote a road safety scheme on Lane End Place between the M621 pedestrian underpass and Beeston Road.

Site 8: Bismarck Street, Beeston

The Issues:

Road safety concerns have been raised by local residents following a number of instances where vehicles have left the carriageway at speed and collided with adjacent dwellings. In order to resolve the concerns and reduce the risk of speeding vehicles leaving the carriageway it is proposed to introduce an additional traffic calming feature in the form of a full width road hump feature on Bismarck Street.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £12,000, comprising of £7,000 works, £3,500 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a road safety scheme to introduce a series of traffic calming measures along Bismarck Street.

Recommendations:

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £12,000, comprising of £7,000 works, £3,500 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a road safety scheme to introduce a series of traffic calming measures along Bismarck Street.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a notice under the provisions of Section 90c of the Highways Act 1980 for the introduction of vertical traffic calming features.

Site 9: B1217 Aberford Road, Aberford

The Issues:

Elected Ward Members, Aberford Parish Councillors and local residents have over the last few years requested traffic management intervention in the form of a reduction of the designated speed limit to address the current accident pattern, which predominantly involves vehicles losing control, particularly on the series of bends and leaving the carriageway at speed.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £11,000, comprising of £6,500 works, £3,500 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Speed Limit Order on Aberford Road, Aberford to reduce the National speed limit to 40mph from Junction 47 of the M1 to the A1(M) bridge.

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £11,000, comprising of £6,500 works, £3,500 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Speed Limit Order on Aberford Road in Aberford.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Speed Limit Order on Aberford Road, Aberford to reduce the National speed limit to 40mph from Junction 47 of the M1 to the A1(M) bridge. and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Order as advertised.

Site 10: Rothwell Ward TRO

The Issues:

Elected Ward Members and local residents have over the last few years requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking at several locations within the Rothwell ward. In the interest of best value for money we have therefore packaged these numerous requests into one ward based scheme to promote a Traffic Regulation Order.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £9,000, comprising of £5,000 works, £3,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce – No Waiting at Any Time restrictions (double yellow lines) at the following junctions within the Rothwell ward and any other locations identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified;

- Haigh Road/Styebank Lane;
- Spibey Lane/Wood Lane;
- Styebank Lane/Park Lane;
- Chapel Lane/New Road;
- St John's Street/Aberford Road;
- A642 Wakefield Road/Oulton Drive;
- Calverley Road/North Lane; and
- A642 Aberford Road/Lynwood Avenue.

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £9,000, comprising of £5,000 works, £3,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order in the Rothwell ward.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Orders as advertised.

Site 11: Ardsley & Robin Hood Ward TRO

The Issues:

Elected Ward Members and local residents have over the last few years requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking at several locations within the Ardsley & Robin Hood ward. In the interest of best value for money we have therefore packaged these numerous requests into one scheme to promote a ward based Traffic Regulation Order.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £9,000, comprising of £5,000 works, £3,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order to introduce – No Waiting at Any Time restrictions (double yellow lines) at the following junctions within the Ardsley & Robin Hood ward and any other locations identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified;

- Haigh Moor Road/Westerton Road;
- Westerton Road/Smithy Lane;
- Lingwell Gate Lane/Longthorpe Lane.
- Constable Road/Smithy Lane;
- Common Lane/Casson Drive; and
- Main Street/Cave Lane

Recommendations:

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £9,000, comprising of £5,000 works, £3,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order in the Ardsley & Robin Hood ward.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Order as advertised.

Site 12: Harewood Ward TRO

The Issues:

Elected Ward Members, local Parish Councils and local residents have over the last few years requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to review existing waiting restrictions and introduce new waiting restrictions to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking at several locations within the Harewood ward. In the interest of best value for money we have therefore packaged these numerous requests into one scheme to promote a ward based Traffic Regulation Order.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £9,000, comprising of £4,500 works, £3,500 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order to review existing

restrictions and introduce – No Waiting at Any Time restrictions (double yellow lines) at the following locations within the Harewood ward and any other locations identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified;

- Shadwell Village Review and where possible reduce the existing waiting restrictions;
- Elmete Avenue, Scholes No Waiting at Any Time restrictions to address obstructive school related parking;
- Aberford Road/Fieldhead Drive, Barwick in Elmet No Waiting at Any Time to address indiscriminate and obstructive parking around junction;

Elected Ward Members and local residents have over the past 12 months requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to review existing waiting restrictions and introduce new waiting restrictions to remove indiscriminate and obstructive general, school related and commuter parking at several locations within the Garforth & Swillington ward. In the interest of best value for money we have therefore packaged these numerous requests into one scheme to promote a ward based Traffic Regulation Order.

Proposals:

- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking on Middleton Park Avenue and revoke the existing one-way system on Middleton Park Road and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Order as advertised.

Site 16: Otley & Yeadon Ward TRO

Site 17: City & Hunslet Ward TRO

The Issues:

Local residents and businesses have over the last 12 months requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to review existing waiting restrictions with a view to removing obstructive parking within the City and to introduce new waiting restrictions to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking at numerous locations within the City & Hunslet ward and to amend various waiting restrictions in the vicinity of the fd Arena including the introduction of a one-way system on Elmwood Road and Duncombe Street.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £17,000, comprising of £11,000 works, £4,500 staff and £1,500 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation and a Movement Order to amend and introduce waiting restrictions and a one-way system at the following locations within the City & Hunslet ward and any other locations identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified;

Site 18: Chapel Allerton Ward TRO

The Issues:

Local residents, local businesses and West Yorkshire Fire Service have over the past 12 months requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to amend existing waiting restrictions to provide an element of on street parking and introduce new waiting restrictions to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking at several locations within the Chapel Allerton ward. In the interest of best value for money we have therefore packaged these numerous requests into one scheme to promote a ward based Traffic Regulation Order.

Proposals:

We seek authority for the expenditure of £9,000, comprising of £4,500 works, £3,500 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order to amend existing waiting restrictions and introduce – No Waiting at Any Time restrictions (double yellow lines) at the following locations within the Chapel Allerton ward and any other locations identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified;

- Barrack Street, Sheepscar Amend the existing waiting restrictions and introduce limited waiting to provide a continuous turnover of parking for the Lexicon House medical facility;

We seek authority for the expenditure of £11,000, comprising of £7,000 works, £3,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order on Chapel Street, Pinfold Lane and Selby Road in Halton and any other roads identified during the consultation exercise which engineers feel are justified.

Recommendations:

- Give authority to incur expenditure of £11,000, comprising of £7,000 works, £3,000 staff and £1,000 legal costs, to promote a Traffic Regulation Order on Chapel Street, Pinfold Lane and Selby Road in Halton.
- Request the City Solicitor to advertise a draft Traffic Regulation Order to remove indiscriminate and obstructive school related parking and if no objections are received, to make, seal and implement the Order as advertised.

Site 20: Beeston and Holbeck Ward TRO

The Issues:

Local Businesses have over the last few years requested traffic management intervention in the form of Traffic Regulations Orders to introduce new waiting restrictions to remove indiscriminate and obstructive parking at several locations within the Beeston & Holbeck ward. In the interest of best value for money we have therefore packaged these numerous requests into one scheme to promote a ward based Traffic Regulation Order.

Proposals:
