Making Leeds the best city to grow old in

For our June meeting we were at St Mary's Church Hall in Garforth. Liz Messenger (Health Improvement Principal) and Carole Clark (Ageing Well Officer) presented the key issues and challenges facing Leeds.

The presentation was followed by table discussions focusing on the problems and issues faced by older residents and suggesting solutions Leeds City Council could adopt for the benefit of all. Questions included:

- What good examples of being age friendly do you know about in your community?
- What else could be done?
- What can *you* offer to make your community more age-friendly?

Attendees were also invited to make a pledge to improve the lives of older people in Leeds...



'Please consider what you can do as an individual, and/or what your organisation can do, to contribute to the actions to make Leeds the Best City to Grow Old in.

Your pledge can be something small and practical or something bigger and more strategic. You can make a pledge on behalf of your service, or as an individual, and if you want to you can make more than one pledge.

Your individual pledge can be something you can do at home, or as a volunteer, or at work.

Please consider carefully what you write, we will be coming back to you in six months' time to ask how you are getting on with fulfilling your pledge.'

A great suggestion that came out of the workshop was the need for additional chairs and accessible toilets (e.g. in shops) for older people to use without them feeling obliged to buy something first.







What else happened at the June meeting?

Presenting our new Chair

Councillor Mary Harland was appointed as Chair of the Outer East Community Committee for the 2016/17 municipal year.

She is one of the councillors for the Kippax and Methley ward and the Communities Team South East wish her every success.





Funding for the following projects were approved:

- £ 25,000 for existing Christmas lights and switch-on events across outer east
- £ 10,000 to support the work of Tasking Teams (crime and grime initiatives)
- £ 5,000 for skips (for our local In Bloom groups, community clean-ups and galas)
- £ 5,000 for older persons event week
- £ 5,000 for the small grants budget

New financial year, new budget! Small grants up to £500 are available for local community and voluntary groups to deliver activities and projects in our area. Email **southeast.ast@leeds.gov.uk** and ask for an **outer east small grant pack**.

Integrated care services

Linda Middlewood, Service Delivery Manager, Adult Social Care and Nyamatore Itai, Leeds Community Healthcare NHS Trust presented a report which highlighted steps taken to provide an integrated service which formerly operated to geographical populations with better care therapy services delivered in clinics or home physiotherapy.

Neighbourhood Teams and integrated services have also been developed to reduce the number of unplanned hospital admissions, provide smoother discharge pathways and support people in the community. The integrated service has also reduced the number of referrals for patients.

From a discussion about the Forward Plan...

Health – It was felt that there were fundamental health issues that should be considered. Reference was made to the closure of the GP surgery in Cross Gates and Whinmoor ward and the lack of consultation.

Flooding – a more detailed update on last year's workshops and outcomes was requested by councillors.

Education – Issues included academic performance, shortage of school places and lack of 6th form provision in the outer east. Children's Services will provide update reports on academic performance to community committee members.

Looking ahead...

It's shaping up to be a great summer of activities for children and young people with activities funded by the Outer East Community Committee's **Youth Activity Fund**.

To date, 15 grants have been approved for 2016/17 to the tune of £70,513 (91% of the budget). The promotional material for the activities are currently being developed and will be available on our social media as soon as possible!
