Current Services that will operate until the 31st March 2017

| Organisation | Service | Details |

| Age UK | Mental Health Hospital Aftercare service | The service provides support to 28 people with mental health needs aged 60 and over living in Leeds. The aim of the service is to provide support to people who are in hospital or have recently been discharged from hospital or are at risk of admission because of their mental health needs. This is a short term intervention service providing support to up to 3 months and works with Care & Repair where clients require minor adaptations in order to return home. |
| Creative Support | Independent Living Service for Older People | This service provides floating support to 110 adults aged 60 years and over who are experiencing moderate to severe mental health problems. Support is provided to clients living in a range of tenure types. The service works with clients to address the day to day difficulties they experience due to their mental health issues and other factors associated with ageing. Support Workers assist clients with getting out and about to reduce social isolation, coping with any concerns, accessing other specialist support services, dealing with money management and benefits, and managing at home. |
| Community Links | Positive Pathways | The PP service consortia provides floating support to 500 adults for a period of up to two years. The service accepts referrals for people who are homeless with mental health problems and those already with accommodation but struggling to maintain independent living. The service also provides peer befriending and support as longer term support option after 2 years. |
| KeyRing | Living Support Networks | The KeyRing support model is based on people living in their own homes but sharing their skills with each other and with their communities. Clients who receive the service are known as 'members'. Network members live in properties which are located within a small neighbourhood area, within walking distance of each other. They are supported for up to one hour per week by a community volunteer trained and supervised by KeyRing. Most clients have a mild learning disability and/or mental health problems. |

| Organisation | Service | Details |
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| Care & Repair Leeds | Housing Choices | The Housing Choices service provides independent advice, information and practical support on housing options available to 50 older people who can no longer manage in their own home due to ill health. This includes advice on how to obtain finance to improve or adapt their homes to enable them to remain independent, or where this is not possible, practical support to move home. The service is available to people who have a disability or are aged 60 or over. The support worker visits clients in their own home to assess their needs and advise them on the different options available. |
| Connect Housing | Connect Floating Support | This service provides floating support to enable people to continue to live independently. This includes people who have experienced a period of homelessness & require support to resettle into their own accommodation, people who may be at threat of becoming homeless & people who may not be suitably housed. |
| | Disabled People | This service provides floating support to 19 disabled people aged 16+ to enable them to continue to live independently in their own homes and reduce the number of hospital and residential care admissions. The service works with households of various compositions and aims to reduce social isolation by facilitating access to services which can support people to maintain independent living. |
| | Older People | The service provides floating support to 15 older people living in their own homes in a variety of tenures. The aim of the service is to provide support to enable older people to maintain independent living. The emphasis is on both practical and emotional support. Help can be provided to set up a new home where necessary, filling in forms, welfare benefits advice and help in accessing other services such as aids and adaptations. The service also supports client to improve their self-esteem and confidence by enabling them access to local services, including leisure activities to combat social isolation. The service provides interventions up to a maximum of two years. |

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| Riverside ECHG | Riverside Floating Support | This service provides floating support to enable people to continue to live independently. This includes people who have experienced a period of homelessness & require support to resettle into their own accommodation, people who may be at threat of becoming homeless & people who may not be suitably housed. |
| Great Places | Great Places Floating Support | The purpose of the service is to provide 110 units of floating support to enable people to continue to live independently. The service works across the City and supports single homeless people and families in times of increased demand to live independently through the provision of housing related support, and to help prevent repeat episodes of homelessness. This will include people who have experienced a period of homelessness and require support to resettle into their own accommodation, people who may be at threat of becoming homeless and people who may not be suitably housed. |
| Sanctuary | Sanctuary Floating Support | The purpose of the service is to provide 82 units of floating support to enable people to continue to live independently. The service works across the City and supports single homeless people and families in times of increased demand to live independently through the provision of housing related support, and to help prevent repeat episodes of homelessness. This will include people who have experienced a period of homelessness and require support to resettle into their own accommodation, people who may be at threat of becoming homeless and people who may not be suitably housed. |
| Foundation | Adult Offender Floating Support | The purpose of the service is to provide 104 units of floating support to people who have history of offending and already have own accommodation to help them live independently. The service is available for up to two years and is delivered city wide. |
| Leeds Housing Concern | DIP/IOM Housing service | The service provides housing related support to 55 people who are subject to the Drug Intervention Programme (DIP) to enable them to achieve independent living, comply with any drug treatment orders and achieve long term recovery. The service provides support to people who have been identified as eligible for DIP following arrest or release from custody. |

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| | | The IOM Anchor service offers short-term support to 30 offenders who are currently detained in regional prisons, including Leeds Prison, due for release who are identified as at risk of re-offending on release due to homelessness or unsuitable move-on accommodation. The service supports these people leading up to release and oversee a planned move into suitable accommodation. |
| CRI | DIP/IOM Housing service | The key purpose of the Drug Intervention Programme is to ensure that an integrated approach is delivered creating an end to end approach for drug misusing offenders from arrest, court, through to arrest. The housing related support needs of these clients, currently provided through the wider DIP/IOM contract will be met by the new visiting support service. The wider contract is subject to a separate review. |
| DISC | DIP/IOM Housing service | The key purpose of the Drug Intervention Programme is to ensure that an integrated approach is delivered creating an end to end approach for drug misusing offenders from arrest, court, through to arrest. The housing related support needs of these clients, currently provided through the wider DIP/IOM contract will be met by the new visiting support service. The wider contract is subject to a separate review. |
