## 2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

The decision to award a new contract to Servelec Synergy for the provision of a suite of ICT solutions to support a range of education and learning related activities. The current contracts for these ICT products are with Servelec so the new contract will be a continuation of the current operational arrangement.

Since the original contract with Tribal (the company that was purchased by Servelec) was entered into (for the Pupil Database which holds a range of information about school age children in the city) a number of additional modules have been purchased and integrated into the Pupil Database system - these include the admissions portal, which allows parents/ carers to select their preferred school on-line, a module to support education health and care plans (a statutory requirement since Sept 2014), eligibility checker for free early education entitlement and an on-line module for child-

care providers to submit claims for the places they are providing. The suite of products are well embedded across Children's Services, are reliable and well supported by the supplier. The contract covers the following support services: Core system for fulfilling education-related services (e.g. pupil database, admissions, Special Educational Needs (SEN), case management), child-care provision, other support functionality (e.g. address gazetteer, portal for provider / remote access, Geographic Information System (GIS) mapping to allow home to school transport and admissions management).
