 - As a result of legislative change or decisions of the Council or Executive in order to maintain it up to date;

Or for the purposes of clarification only.

2.2 The Monitoring Officer has sub-delegated her functions in respect of the Constitution to the Head of Governance Services.

3 Main issues

Responsibility for School Appeals

- 3.1 In order to make efficient use of Council resources responsibility for the provision of school appeals has been transferred from Governance Services to the Children's Services directorate the transition of the oversight of these responsibilities was concluded at the end of September. In accordance with an earlier decision of the Head of Governance Services Part 3 Section 1 (Responsibility for Local Choice Functions) of the Constitution was amended with effect from the 1st October 2016.
- 3.2 The Head of Governance and Scrutiny Support is now recommended to approve amendments to the Officer Delegation Scheme (Council (non-executive) Functions) to show the reflect of the functions listed from City Solicitor to Director of Children's Services.
