The Warm Well Homes scheme will enable front line health and social care staff to refer residents suffering from severe cold related illnesses such as cardio-vascular illness, respiratory illness and mental illness for heating and insulation improvements. This will make it less likely that their conditions are worsened by living in cold, damp conditions and will help them to stay for longer in their own homes, relieving pressure on health and social services.

We know that residents suffering from cardio-vascular illness, respiratory illness and mental illness are particularly vulnerable to the effects of living in a cold damp home from the <u>NICE guidance on excess winter deaths and illness and the health risks associated</u> with living in cold homes. We also know that residents in fuel poverty, i.e. those with comparatively low incomes and high fuel costs are more likely to have difficulty keeping their homes warm. It therefore makes sense to target interventions towards those vulnerable residents who suffer from cold related illness and who are either in, or at risk of falling into fuel poverty.
