Point 4 Surely a 'Family pub' must have a 'cut-off time' when food stops being served ?

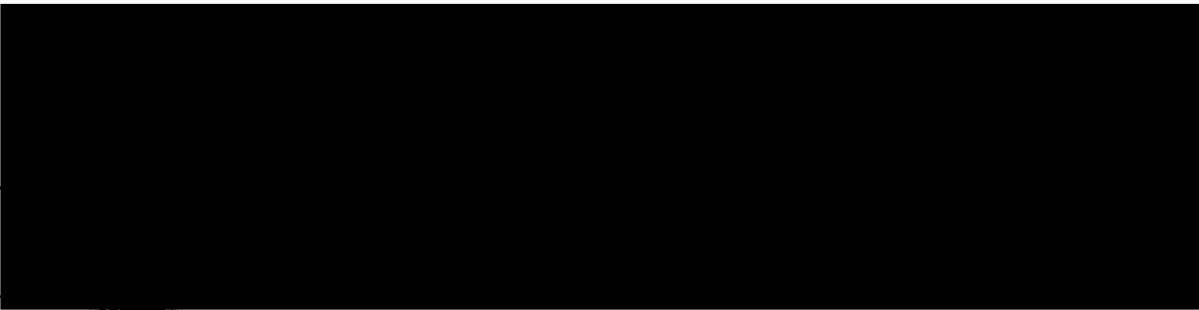

For many years having uniformed opening hours and a DPPO Has meant that street drinking and late night moving from pub to pub in search of a late license has broadly ceased

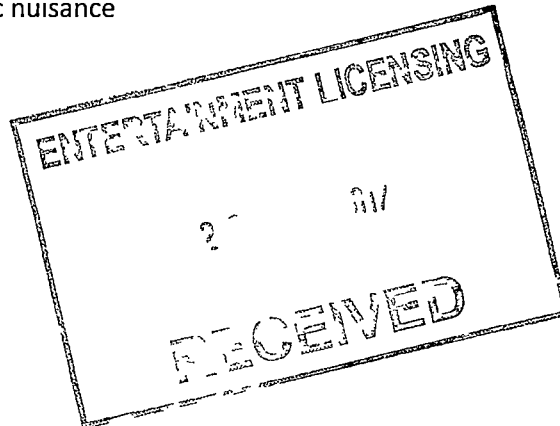
Having a pub with a weekend license over and above the others will lead to drunkenness in public and have a negative impact on crime in what is, a heavily built up, residential area
