2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

Main aim

- As a consequence of the increasing birth rate in Leeds, it is necessary to provide temporary modular accommodation to support the 2017 Bulge programme at various Schools in Leeds. The accommodation will be available for the start of the September 2017 term.
- 2. These schemes will be delivered under the City Council's Learning Places 2017 Bulge Programme which aims to ensure its statutory duties are met with respect to ensuring a school place for every child within the city.
- 3. The proposal for the installation of temporary accommodation to support the 2017 bulge cohorts forms part of the on-going work to address capacity and sufficiency across all of Children's Services. These proposals form part of the Council's Learning Places Programme that embeds the 'one council' approach that has achieved shared ownership of proposed solutions.

4. The total number of school sites requiring additional modular accommodation is to be confirmed. Current data identifies 5 schools may require additional temporary modular accommodation to ensure sufficient pupil places for the start of the September term 2017. This information is based on current pupil numbers and demographic predictions.

School Briefing

Senior staff will be involved in the development of the proposals and key considerations regarding accessibility will be included within the design.

Councillor Briefing Sessions

Local ward members will be kept abreast of the proposed sites requiring a temporary bulge cohort and their subsequent development as the schemes progress.

School Governing Body

The school governing body will be informed of the proposal and encouraged to feedback with comments.
