In March 2017 the Council received notification that its joint bid with the City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council to deliver the European Structural and Investment Fund (ESIF) Local Flexibility to Reduce Unemployment Programme had been successful.

The STEP programme is specifically aimed at supporting identified disadvantaged groups. An Equality, Diversity, Cohesion and Integration Impact Assessment for the programme was previously completed on 23 August 2016. This assessment confirmed that due consideration has been given to all equality groups, including people with mild to moderate mental ill-health, adults 25 years plus and previously in care and older people 50 years plus, identified as local priorities for Leeds.

In November 2016, the Chief Officer Employment and Skills approved the procurement of services to be delivered in Leeds. Following a competitive tendering and evaluation process, six preferred providers have been identified and are recommended to deliver on the Leeds STEP programme. The providers will deliver services to priority groups in accordance with DWP's outcome specifications and in line with the Council's priorities. This includes mental health, drug and alcohol and BME / ESOL specialist services.

The price model for the STEP Programme was predetermined in the ESIF funding bid submission (a DWP requirement) and therefore the preferred providers have been selected on 100% quality.


