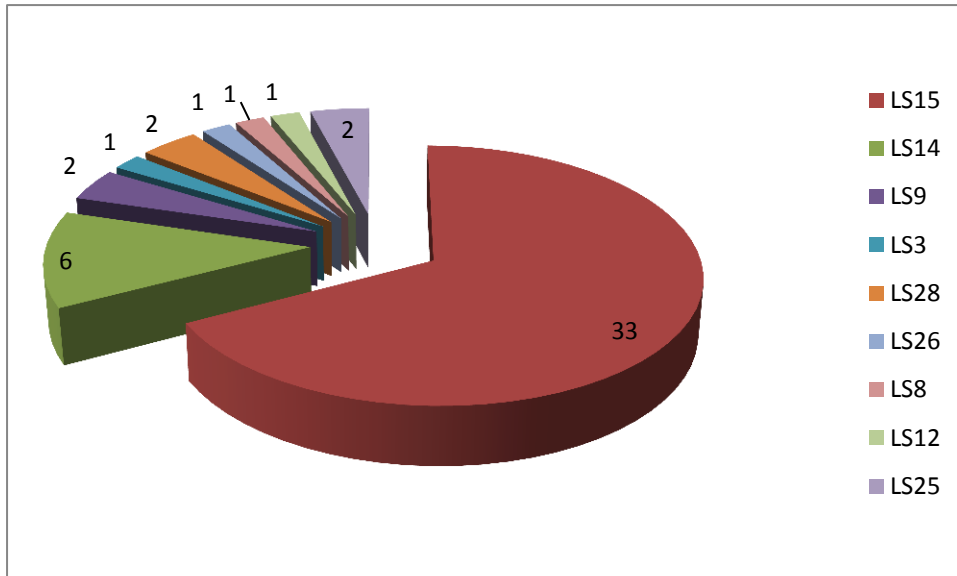


Consultation - Temple Newsam Golf Course Reconfiguration

The public consultation period closed on 28th February 2017 and in total, 49 responses were received and a summary of these results were as follows

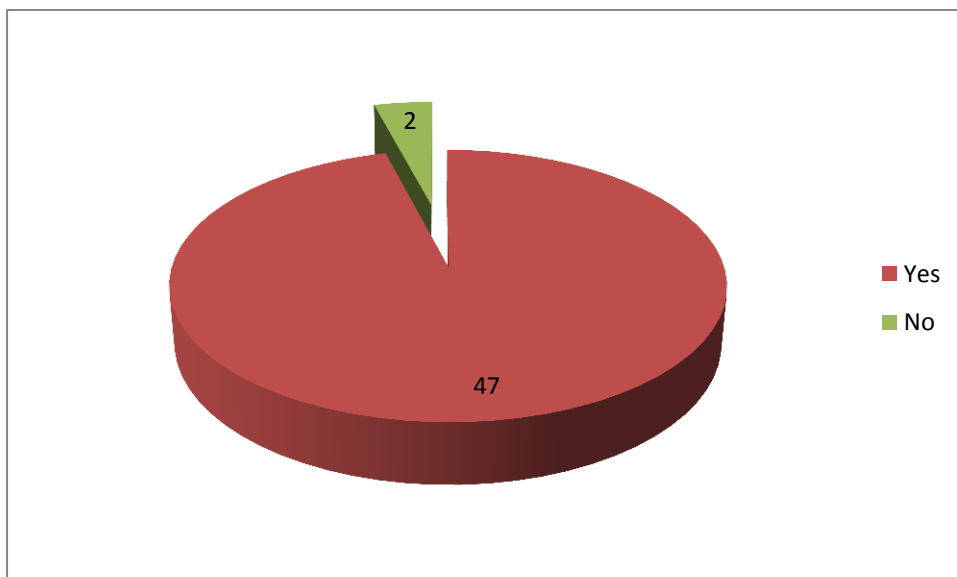
Question 1.

Please indicate where you live by stating your postcode



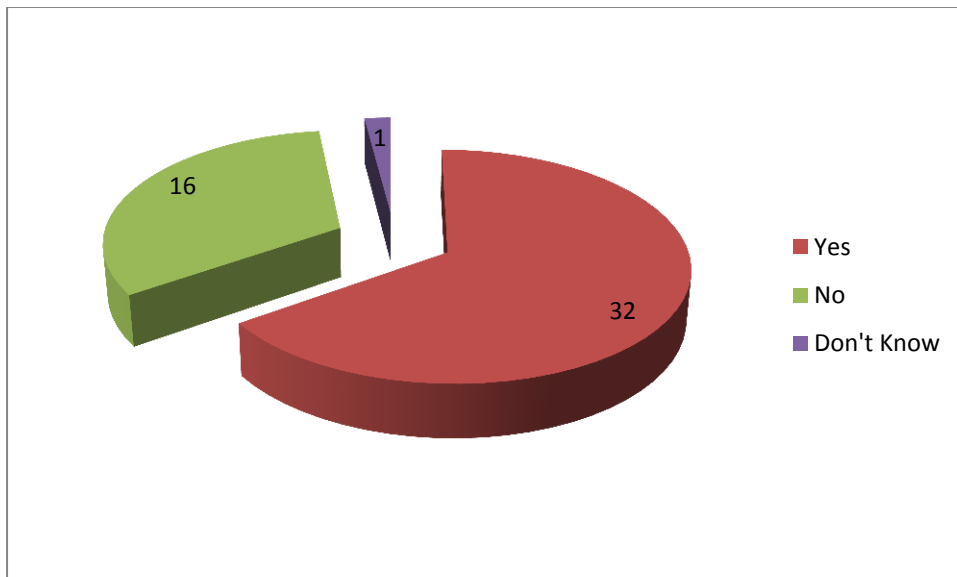
Question 2.

For those that answered no, the general comments were as follows

- Lack of promotion
- Course layout is good it is the decline in course conditions and lack of maintenance which has caused the situation
- Classic layout and design by Dr Alistair Mackenzie this connection isn't promoted enough
- Get McKenzie society in to help redesign and promote this more
- Don't think a redesign will encourage anymore players to the course. Club history needs to be kept
- Already lost Middleton, closing 9 here is just the start to complete closure
- Historic McKenzie connection, this shouldn't be done just to save money
- History should be preserved
- Wrong response to issue, more promotion, link with colleges to use course for training staff to improve maintenance and reduce costs
- Invest more in the course and within Temple Newsam Estate

- Agree, On condition staff numbers remain same
- Agree, Provided the courses are keep up to scratch
- Good opportunity to be able to play golf for longer in life, having a less challenging course option
- Better than full course closure
- Need to promote golf more amongst the younger generation
