## Summary of main issues

1. To authorise the signing of a Partnership Agreement related to the Digital Enterprise Project (project number – 20R15P00625). The agreement shares responsibility for the current ESIF funding agreement with a consortium of local authorities. Authorisation to enter into the partnership agreement was approved at Executive Board on the 9<sup>th</sup> March 2016 (see minute 146).

#### Recommendation

2. To approve entering into the Partnership Agreement for the Digital Enterprise Project (project No -20R15P00625).

#### Purpose of this report

1.1 To seek authorisation from the Chief Officer Economy and Regeneration to proceed with the Partnership Agreement which shares local authority match funding contributions and associated responsibilities with a City Region Local Authority Partnership.

## 2 Background information

The Partnership Agreement formalises the relationship between the 9 local authorities involved in the Digital Enterprise Project.

The Digital Enterprise programme will deliver a comprehensive package of services to at least 1000 eligible SMEs in the Leeds city region area over a 3 year period. It will encourage firms to take-up faster digital connectivity or introduce enhanced ICT systems to improve business performance, through the provision of grants.

2.1 The programme will be delivered by Leeds City Council on behalf of a partnership of local authorities within the Leeds city region and the West Yorkshire Combined Authority.

#### 3 Main issues

3.1 To date, 8 local authorities have signed the Partnership Agreement. However, a signature is required from all 9 authorities for it to become an enforceable legal document. Hence, authority is sought for Leeds City Council to sign the Agreement.

Once signed by Leeds and dated by all partners, the Partnership Agreement will become an active and valid legal agreement which will govern the programme.

## 3.2 Consultation and Engagement

- 3.2.1 Early engagement with the digital supply sector across the Leeds city region has been undertaken on the programme, which will help to drive demand for Vouchers.
- 3.2.2 Local authority partners have been consulted on the development of the programme, via several Steering group meetings.
- 3.2.3 Small and medium sized businesses have been surveyed via an online survey in February/March 2016 about their ICT/digital technology requirements the results used to design the programme.

## 3.5 Resources and value for money

- 3.5.1 The project is worth a total of £8,462,950. The local authority contribution is £250,000 which includes a contribution of £69,250 from Leeds City Council.
- 3.5.2 The return on local authority investment is estimated to be in excess of £30 for every £1 invested in the project.
