Summary of main issues

1 This report seeks approval to enhance the existing UTMC CCTV network by providing additional cctv coverage in Leeds to assist in the management of the network, and enhancements to cctv access within Middleton complex.

Recommendations

- 2 The Chief Officer (Highways and Transportation) is requested to:
 - i) note the contents of this report.
 - ii) approve the proposal at the total cost of £40,000 and
 - iii) give authority to incur expenditure of £35,000 works costs and £5,000 staff costs, to be funded from the LTP Transport Policy Capital Programme (100% Government grant funding).

1. Purpose of this report

To seek approval for the procurement of cctv equipment to provide UTMC, Network Management, Flood Risk Management and Traffic with an enhanced cctv coverage of the network. The current system has a number of IP cameras and it is proposed that additional IP (Internet Protocol) cameras will be purchased to assist in the monitoring of the network.

2. Background information

- 2.1 In 2015/16 funding provided UTMC with a dedicated cctv server to control and record cctv images. The number of IP (internet protocol) cameras installed on this system was also slightly increased.
- 2.2 The installation of additional cameras on our network will assist in UTMC and Highways operations and enable coverage over congested areas currently not available.
- 2.3 The cameras will also be available to Leeds Watch colleagues in Neighbourhood and Housing to use in crime and disorder situations and provide images for Highways departments to assist daily operations.

3. Main issues

3.1 Design Proposals/Scheme Description

3.1.1 The expansion of the UTC camera network will be achieved with the addition of up to 10 IP cameras, but this will be dependent on site suitability and access. The equipment will be procured through contract 3548 Supply & installation of traffic signal equipment, IComply and LCC Building services and IT departments.

3.2 Programme

3.2.1 It is proposed to start work as soon as approval is received. Work will continue throughout the financial year 2017/2018.

4. Corporate Considerations

4.1 Consultation and Engagement

4.1.1 Consultation will not be undertaken as the cameras will only be used for monitoring traffic conditions on the network .

4.2 Equality and Diversity / Cohesion and Integration

4.2.1 A screening document has been prepared and is attached as Appendix 1. An independent impact assessment is not required for the approvals requested. The screening document has been sent to the Equality Team to be approved and published.

- 4.3.2 Proposal 4:to minimise congestion. The CCTV system gives UTMC operators vital information to help them tackle queues and congestion

4.4 Resources and Value for Money

- 4.4.1 Scheme Design Estimate and Funding: The estimated total cost for this scheme is £40,000 consisting of £35,000 works costs and £5,000 staff costs, which will be funded from the LTP Transport Policy Capital Programme (100% Government grant funding). It is proposed to procure the equipment through the contract 3548 Supply & Installation of traffic signal equipment, Icomply, LCC IT and building services will also provide support for this scheme.
- 4.4.2 Capital Funding and Cash Flow.

- **4.5 Revenue Implications**: There are additional cost implications with regard to provision of ADSL circuits for CCTV operation at £350 per annum. Not all the locations will require their own line, depending on the configuration of nearby signal communications.
- **4.6** Legal Implications, Access to Information and Call In: The scheme is not eligible for call in because it falls below the relevant thresholds.
- **4.7 Risk Management:** Failure to implement this scheme will mean the CCTV coverage of the road network will not be improved.

5. Conclusions

5.1 Network coverage is a vital part of the UTMC function. The investment in UTMC communications over the last few years has allowed UTMC to install camera equipment at a fraction of the cost of previous years. The increase in traffic levels throughout Leeds are the driving force to increase coverage of our network and assist in managing issues that can affect congestion.
