Demolition of 18 garages, 10 of which are empty and 8 rented, is required to open up potential for new housing to be developed (2-3 adapted properties for people with additional needs and or disabilities). The majority of garages have are in a poor state of repair and are attracting anti-social behaviour. Demolition is supported by the local community and Ward Members.

City Development would like to progress the site in question for the development of 2-3 lifetime home properties for people who are on a waiting list for adapted properties within the area who have disabilities or additional needs. This could be seen as an advancement in equality of opportunity and will hopefully mean that the beneficiaries of the housing will be able to enjoy good quality housing which is adapted to suit their

individual needs.

The garages in their current state attract anti social behaviour in respect of some vandalism and fly tipping. Their removal would address resident concerns about community safety which will impact positively on cohesion.

Consultation with the residents currently using the garages and residents who are adjacent to the site has been undertaken and their comments taken into consideration in the preparation of the report and recommendation to demolish.

Key findings

The development of adapted properties would have a positive impact on the lives of people living with long term health conditions and their carers in terms of ensuring that the property is designed specifically with an individual's needs in mind, therefore helping them live more easily with their condition. The properties will be designed to the Leeds Standard.

Creation of new homes in the area increases opportunity for new residents to integrate within the local community and have access to local facilities, services and community networks for support.

The new homes will be targeted to families meeting the criteria for housing need. The development of new homes at this location will be subject to the usual planning application process which offers opportunity for comment from the local community in regard to any concerns about the development.

Anyone displaced from renting a garage currently can be offered alternative locations in the area which will help to consolidate tenancies at those garage sites.
