EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This scheme is to aid the regeneration of Yeadon High Street, a historic conservation area, by making significant improvements to the public realm and pedestrian use of the area. This will be achieved by creating a greater sense of arrival, a uniform approach to street furniture, improvements to the town hall square and creating a safer environment through CCTV. Pedestrian usages will be improved through increasing the width of footpaths and providing safe crossing points. These improvements would help support local businesses in the town by increasing the footfall and desirability of Yeadon town centre as a shopping location.

The scheme includes a 3 camera CCTV system costing £ 53,400 details of which were agreed on a previous DCR. This DCR covers works to the area in front of the Town Hall, including re-orientation of the bus island to provide a larger level area with planting and a yorkstone flagged area directly in front of the Town Hall steps with seating and planting. These works will be detailed on a subsequent Design & Cost Report once planning permission has been granted.

The scheme forms part of the Yeadon Town and District Centre Regeneration Scheme which was supported by Asset Management Group on 20th October 2006.

1.0 PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

1.1 This report seeks the approval for the scheme design and the capital expenditure of £739,432 construction fees plus SDA fees of £98,106, Highways fees of £67,500 and Housing Internal Charges £ 36,180 making a total capital spend of **£941,218**.

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Town and District Centre Regeneration Scheme capital allocation of money has made available £11.75 million across the city for Town and District Centre improvements schemes.
- 2.2 Under the Town & District Centre Regeneration Scheme, proposals have been drawn up for Yeadon which were supported by Asset Management Group on 20th October 2006.

3.0 DESIGN PROPOSALS / SCHEME DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The scheme includes the following works:
 - Landscaping of the roundabout at the top of the High Street and improved location of the Yeadon name stone to provide a sense of arrival
 - Landscaped traffic island outside Morrison's to incorporate a pelican crossing point
 - Clearly marked parking bays along the High Street
 - Traffic dominance reduced by reduction in road width, use of similar materials on the highway and footpath and a 20mph zone in operation
 - Resurfacing of the highway with a Rocbinda product
 - Resurfacing of the footpath with Yorkstone and granite kerbstones
 - A coherent range of heritage style street furniture to be introduced
 - Installation of finger posts and information board

- Prior to the writing of this report SDA undertook a feasibility study of the area and proposed improvements. Reference B2103400/T/YEADON/001 Yeadon High Street Regeneration. The layout of the scheme is attached at Appendix 1.

4.0 MAIN ISSUES

- 4.1 Negotiations are currently underway between SDA and Planning Services with regards to the part of this scheme that involves works in front of the Town Hall. Planning permission is being sought and once agreed a DCR will be presented that will cover these works. It is envisaged that this work would be carried out under the same contract as the rest of the scheme.
- 4.2 Traffic management arrangements will be in place during the works. Once the details of these have been agreed they will be advertised locally and circulated to traders.
- 4.3 A weekly Tuesday market is held in front of Yeadon Town Hall. Due to the small number of stalls at this market it is envisaged that the market will be able to be accommodated throughout the period of works.
- 4.4 A small piece of land constituting the footpath infront of Morrisons complex is owned by Morrisons Plc and is included within the proposed scheme. Under the TDC protocol of engagement with the private sector, Morrisons Plc will be asked to contribute towards the cost of the work undertaken in the land owned by them.

7.0 SCHEME DESIGN ESTIMATE

The scheme was designed by the Strategic Design Alliance and estimated costs for construction works are based upon a cost estimate from January 2007.

Breakdown of costs:

Construction Works £739,432 Highways Fees £ 67,500

SDA Fees £ 98,106 (including £ 10,000 fees for feasibility study).

Housing Internal Fees £ 36,180

Total £941,218

7.1 This will be financed by a Town and District Centre Regeneration budget allocation of £1,038,600 and £ 40,000 from S106 from Planning Board. Total available: £1,078,600. An expenditure of £ 53,410 already given authority to spend on 18/10/07 for CCTV cameras, leaving an available balance of £ 1,025,200. Once this expenditure of £ 941,218 is authorized, an amount of £ 83,982 will be left for completing the works in Town Hall Square including fees.
