The revision of the existing Tenancy Agreement for Gypsy and Travellers sets out the respective rights and responsibilities of council tenants and Leeds City Council in its role as a social landlord. The Tenancy Agreement is a legal contract between the two parties.

To meet the criteria of the grant funding from the HCA (Homes and Community Agency) we have set the rents in line with the Affordable Housing Scheme set at 20% less than the market value for Gypsy and Traveller accommodation elsewhere in the city.

The Council also has a legal duty to promote equality and harmony between Gypsies and Travellers and the settled community.
