1. Purpose of this report

1.1 This report sets out the annual update in accordance with paragraph 5.1 of the Member Allowances Scheme.

2. Background information

- 2.1 Article 15.2.3 provides that the City Solicitor, in her role as Monitoring Officer, is authorised to make any changes to any part of the Constitution which are required:-
 - As a result of legislative change or decisions of the Council or Executive to enable them to maintain it up to date; or
 - For the purposes of clarification only.
- 2.2 The City Solicitor has sub delegated this authority to the Head of Democratic Services.

3. Main issues

- 3.1 At its meeting on 10th July 2019 Council approved recommendations of the Independent Remuneration Panel, namely that;
 - I. Basic, special responsibility and dependent carers' allowances be increased each October in line with the headline pay increase negotiated through the National Joint Council for Local Government Employees and that this indexation continue until June 2023. Paragraph 5.1 of the Members' Allowances Scheme was amended in July 2019 to reflect this recommendation.
- 3.2 Amendments are now proposed to the Members' Allowances Scheme to give effect to the annual uplift. The amendments are set out at Appendix 1 to this report.
