	The decision was taken in consideration of views from providers who responde to the FEEE consultation which ran from 8 th January 2024 – 4 th February 2024.			
	On the whole, respondents were positive about the funding formula proposed in the consultation. Several providers expressed that they felt the DfE's rates for all age ranges should be more consistent to prevent providers opting to offer certain age ranges only, and to prevent parents from having a significant increase in fees as their child gets older. The consultation responses also raised concerns about closures of settings due to financial difficulties impacted by NI contribution increases, minimum wage and national living wage increases, increases in utility and food bills, reintroduction of business rates and increases in agency costs.
