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| | <p>Ltd) have paid the Local Authority Section 106 education contributions totalling £156,100.83 to be used towards the provision of and/or improvement of secondary educational facilities within Temple Newsam ward required as a consequence of the development.</p> <p>Temple Moor High School is the closest secondary school to families living in the Temple Point, Bullerthorpe Lane housing development at 1.407 miles (straight line distance). Temple Moor is also located within the Temple Newsam ward.</p> <p>October 2022 census showed that the majority of secondary aged children living on the development were attending Temple Moor High School.</p> <p>Temple Moor will continue to provide a long-term solution to meet the housing generated demand from this development. Therefore, it is appropriate for the S106 secondary education contributions, paid by the developers of this site, to be directed towards meeting the capital cost of improvement works at the school.</p> <p>Temple Moor has admitted an additional 30 pupils above their Published Admission Number (PAN) of 210 from 2018 onwards, subsequently increasing their PAN to 240 permanently from 2023, without any physical expansion of the school taking place. Admitting the additional pupils has put pressure on communal areas of the school including the dining facilities. A range of works have been proposed which will address legacy issues and allow adequate dining for the school's new PAN of 240.</p> <p>At January 2024's Good Learning Places Board, support was given to allocate £156,100.83 of Section 106 education contributions, paid to the Local Authority by Strata Homes Ltd, against school improvement works at Temple Moor High School.</p> |
| | <p>Brief details of any alternative options considered and rejected by the decision maker at the time of making the decision</p> <p>Temple Moor High School is the closest secondary school to the Temple Point, Bullerthorpe Lane housing development and is popular with the families living there. It is also located within the Temple Newsam ward. There are no other suitable options available that would meet the conditions of the Section 106 agreement in question.</p> <p>Allocating the S106 education funding to school improvement works at Temple Moor High School will ensure places remain available to meet future demand from this development. Therefore, providing Temple Moor High School with this funding is a good value for money option.</p> |
