- Approve with reference to powers contained in Section 65 (1) of the Highways Act construction of shared used footways / cycleways as shown on plan 733366-LCC-HWT-XX-DR-CH-01_001.
- Approve with reference to powers contained in Section 66 (1) of the Highways Act construction of footways as shown on plan 733366-LCC-HWT-XX-DR-CH-01_001, along both sides of the new vehicular accesses.
- j. Approve with reference to powers contained in Section 96 (2) of the Highways Act the removal or alteration of existing grass verge along the northern side of Manston Lane to allow for footway widening in relation to the new raised toucan crossing as shown on plan 733366-LCC-HWT-XX-DR-CH-01_001.

Authorise the City Solicitor to advertise a notice under the provisions of Section 90C of the Highways Act 1980 in order to inform the public of the new raised tables on each of the new site accesses road and if no valid objections are received, to continue with the works as advertised.

A brief statement of the reasons for the decision

- Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980 allows Highways Authorities to enter into agreements with developers for the execution of highway works at the developer's expense. The preconditions for an agreement under Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980 are, first, that the Highway Authority should be satisfied that it will be of benefit to the public to enter into an agreement for the execution of the works and, secondly, that the work must fall within the Highway Authority's powers of road building, improvement and maintenance.
- 2. The proposals within this report are concerned only with the delivery of the off-site highway works, the principle of these works having been considered and accepted as part of the planning process for planning consent A full planning permission (18/07433/FU) was granted in 26th August 2020 for a proposed development of 437 dwellings with new roads, open space, landscaping, drainage and associated works. The location of the development site is shown on drawing LOCATION_PLAN-4076252 provided at Appendix 2 of this report. A General Arrangement Plan (drawing ref: 733366-LCC-HWT-XX-DR-CH-01_001) is provided at Appendix 3 of this report.
- 3. The development requires a package of highway improvements along Manston Lane which are described in detail in paragraph **4** below.
- 4. The highway works are required to provide adequate and safe vehicular, pedestrian and cyclist access to/from the development and to/from the surrounding community/ facilities. The proposed works as shown on 733366-LCC-HWT-XX-DR-CH-01_001 will comprise:
- 5. Construction of 2 new vehicular accesses (a third, eastern access is to be provided by the developer and included in the S38 agreement) for the development as follows:

Western Junction

6. Vehicular access with provision of a right turn ghost island lane with widened carriageway and new kerb lines to tie-in with the existing and footway to both sides

- Informal crossing on Manston Lane to the east and west of the Western Access with dropped kerbs, tactile paving and refuge island to facilitate pedestrian movements.
- Bus Stops ID 45012074 and ID 45012073 on the southern side of Manston Lane to be removed and consolidated into one bus stop between the Western and Central Junctions.

Central Junction

- 9. Vehicular access with provision of a right turn ghost island lane with widened carriageway and new kerb lines to tie-in with the existing, and footway to the eastern side..
- 10. Informal crossing on Manston Lane between the Western Access and Central Access with dropped kerbs and tactile paving to facilitate pedestrian movements to and from the new bus stop, and a footpath link from the development.
- 11. Informal crossing to the west of the central access with dropped kerbs, tactile paving and a refuge island to facilitate pedestrians movements
- 12. Provision of new cycletrack for shared use by pedestrians and cyclists on the southern side of Manston Lane along the frontage of the proposed development, to tie in with existing provision to the east and new provision within the development, with a further relocation of bus stop ID 45032099 to facilitate the eastern access and informal pedestrian crossing of Manston Lane to access this bus stop and the eastern end of the development.
- 13. A raised toucan crossing on Manston Lane to the east of Sandleas Way, including dropped kerbs and tactile paving, with footway widening on the northern side of Manston to ensure a suitable cycetrack for shared use width once the crossing is installed.
- 14. The redundant accesses to the development to be closed and reinstated to full height kerbs with verge/cycletrack/footway.
- 15. All associated Civils works, including (inter alia) reconstruction, tie-ins, resurfacing, signing, lighting, drainage and lining works etc.
- Any works reasonably required following safety audits of the design and construction of the highway works; and
- 17. Any associated statutory undertaker's work resulting from the Works.
- 18. All associated civils works, including (inter alia) reconstruction, tie-ins, resurfacing, lighting, signing, drainage and lining works etc;
- 19. Any associated statutory undertakers' works resulting from the works; and
- 20. Any works reasonably required following safety audits of the design and construction of the highway works.
- 21. To meet the requirements of the planning permission and deliver the highway improvements outlined above the developer seeks to enter into a Section 278 Agreement (Highways Act 1980) to enable the highways works to be carried out.

- 22. This report seeks authority to negotiate terms and enter into a S278 Agreement for the highway works associated with the development to allow the Council to design and construct the works at the developer's expense.
- 23. The planned highway works will contribute to the Best Council Plan by maintaining and improving the safety of Leeds residents and enabling safe pedestrian, cycle and vehicular access in the local community.
