School Streets Trials were implemented in Leeds in three Phases by Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders (TTROs), six from the 1st June 2020, a further eight from 5th September 2020 and most recently three in September 2023.

Recommendations from the evaluation of phase 1 and 2, including selection criteria for future School Streets, were approved by Highways Board in November 2022.

Active Travel Funds have been allocated by WYCA for 2 further School Streets (Phase 4) in Leeds. These schemes needed to be fully committed by Easter 2024 and need to be implemented by the end of March 2025.

Brief details of any alternative options considered and rejected by the decision maker at the time of making the decision.

The alternative would be discontinuing the implementation of School Streets in Leeds and continuing to address school gate parking issues with other parking restrictions and travel behaviour change interventions. Leeds City Council would be unable to draw down £70,000 of funding secured by the WYCA for additional School Streets.
