Your Area Committee

The Area Committee meets six times a year, and is responsible for overseeing public services in the area to ensure they meet the needs of the communities they serve. Each year, the Area Committee consults with local residents to create an annual Area Delivery Plan that sets out priority actions for the Council and its partners within our neighbourhoods.

The Committee also has a Well-being budget to spend on supporting the actions in the Area Delivery Plan. In past years this has been spent on a wide range of activities including providing extra services for older people, additional parks maintenance and a youth service van to deliver activities to young people in their own neighbourhoods.













You said... We did

We've done much over the past year, here are some examples how we've turned residents' suggestions into actions:

Residents are concerned about crime and community safety. The Committee funds many police initiatives to help tackle crime and anti-social behaviour across the area, including a capture car to act as a deterrent to car theft, a test purchasing scheme to prevent alcohol being sold to under-age children, an off road motorbike team to tackle nuisance bikes, and a speed indicator device to catch motorists speeding on our roads.

Residents wanted to help preserve the distinct character of their neighbourhoods from inappropriate new developments. The Area Committee has funded a number of conservation area reviews and appraisals across the area including Guiseley, Rawdon, Horsforth, Bramhope and Yeadon. We also funded the Horsforth Neighbourhood Design Statement which was developed by local residents.

Residents in Otley complained about dog fouling especially on Otley Chevin. We have paid for extra dog warden patrols around Otley as well as organising education events on Otley Chevin to raise the public's awareness of anti-dog fouling and environmental protection.
