#### **Executive Summary**

This report informs members of an application to vary a Premises Licence for premises situated at 157 Moorgate Road, Kippax, Leeds, LS25 7ET trading as Sainsburys Supermarkets Ltd.

A Premises Licence Variation application has been received to extend the opening hours of the Premises 06:00 to 00:00 everyday with the Supply of Alcohol during the said hours and to add the provision of Late Night Refreshment everyday 23:00 to 00:00.

The application is to also remove all embedded restrictions referred to in the Premises Licence under the heading Embedded Restrictions in respect of Justices's off Licence attached at Appendix A and to add to Annex 2 the conditions noted in section P of the application form attached at Appendix C

#### Purpose of this Report

- To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a Premises Licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt to representations.

#### 2.0 History of Premises

An application for the conversion and variation of the former Licenses into a Premises Licence was submitted in June 2005 by Jacksons Stores Limited under the Licensing Act 2003. Representations were received from West Yorkshire Police and Members of the Public to the conversion and variation. The variation application was subsequently withdrawn and a Premise Licence was granted for the existing hours.

A Licence transfer was recieved on the 12th December 2007 to change the Licence holder from Jackson Stores Limited to Sainsburys Supermarkets Limited

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### **Embedded Restrictions in respect of Justices' off licence**

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:


- The Moorgate Road area is primarily a residential area
- There is already a problem with litter from the commercial premises and this blows around into garden areas. Any extension of hours will increase this problem for residents.
- Visitors by car to the above premises already create congestion through inconsiderate and illegal parking by parking on pavements, especially at peak hours. Access to and from the residential area is very often difficult at the junction of Moorgate Road and Leeds Road and drivers are forced into the centre of the road when negotiating a 'blind' corner into the estate. There is a very real danger of accidents occurring. Extension to opening hours will potentially increase this problem.

I write on behalf of my colleagues Councillors Keith Parker and Keith Wakefield and myself to object to this application on the following grounds.

- The store is located in a predominately residential area, not a S3A shopping area as identified in the Leeds Unitary Development Plan, and we believe that the extended hours and the noise caused by customers, additional traffic and people exiting cars would create an unacceptable nuisance.
- Kippax has been declared a Designated Public Place Order in light of the
  problems caused by persistent alcohol related anti-social behaviour.
  Given that local residents have reported problems around this store, as
  recorded in numerous objections to this application, we believe that this
  application risks undoing the good results that has been recently
  achieved by joint working with the Police, Kippax Parish Council and
  residents groups, and others to reduce the problems.
