Executive Summary

This report informs members of an application to vary a Premises Licence for premises situated at 2 Ash Road, Headingley, Leeds, LS6 3JF, trading as Sainsbury's.

An application to vary the Premises Licence to extend the timings for Sale of Alcohol, Late Night Refreshment and the opening times of the premises. The applicant further wishes to remove conditions on the licence and replace them with new conditions detailed within the application.

Please see paragraph 3.4 for proposed times of operation and activities and Section P of the operating schedule for proposed conditions.

Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a Premises Licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt to representations.

2.0 History of Premises

- 2.1 An application for the conversion and variation of the former licence into a Premises Licence was submitted on 1st August 2005 under the Licensing Act 2003. No objections were received and the application was granted as applied for.
- 2.2 A copy of the existing licence (including all conditions) is attached at Appendix A.
- 3.0 The Application
- 3.1 The applicant is Sainsbury's Supermarkets Limited,
- The location of the premises can be found on the map attached as Appendix B.
- 3.3 A copy of the application and operating schedule are attached as Appendix C to this report. For the assistance of members, the Operating Schedule shows:

5.0 Matters Relevant to the Application

- 5.1 Members of the Licensing Sub Committee must make decisions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives which are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder
 - Public safety
 - The prevention of public nuisance
 - The protection of children from harm
- In the making of their decision Members are obliged to have regard to the national guidance and the council's licensing policy. Members will be aware they must also have regard to the relevant representations made and evidence they hear.
- 5.3 Members should note that these premises fall within a Cumulative Impact Area.
 The Cumulative Impact Policy for this area reads as follows:

It is the council's policy, on receipt of relevant representations, to refuse applications in Area 2 for premises which are predominantly 'alcohol-led'. It is also the council's policy to refuse applications to materially extend the opening hours of any licensed premise within the area.

In addition it is also the council's policy on receipt of relevant representations to refuse applications for new premises seeking a licence to provide hot food between 11.00 pm and 5.00 am where the food is purchased to take away from the premises as opposed to premises where the food is to be consumed on the premises and whilst patrons are seated at tables provided for that purpose.

6.0 Options available to members

- The licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - Grant the variation application as requested.
 - Grant the variation application whilst modifying the conditions of the licence.
 - Reject the whole or part of the variation application.
- Members of the Licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be <u>necessary</u> in order to promote the licensing objectives.



Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
 - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Embedded restrictions attached to the licence by virtue of grandfather rights.

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, 8 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day, 10 a.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- c. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- 4. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
 - a. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - b. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- 5. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

General – All four licensing objectives

- 8. All new staff receive induction training in respect of:
 - a. their store and the services it delivers;
 - b. their store opening stores

- C. Health and Safety/Legal issues, in particular the sale of products outside sell by dates and the age restricted products;
- Company policy and procedures, including staff dress, equal opportunities, hygiene, discipline/grievance and security;
- e. merchandising, including shelf filing and price labeling.
- The Company operates, in respect of all age restricted products, a due dilligence system. In relation to alcohol products, it is designed to ensure that no salesof alcohol occur in breach of the Licensing Laws. This system involves:

10. Staff Training

- a. All staff induction training carried out by a member of the Company's training team. The induction training includes specific training on a retailers legal responsibilities arising in respect of age restricted products.
- b. Insofar as induction training relates to retailers legal responsibilities arising in respect of the sale of alcohol, the induction training involves a written test in which the staff member must obtain a 100% mark to pass.
- c. The induction training is fully documented and the staff member is required to sign to certify that they have received induction training.

11. Staff In-Store training

Subsequent to completion of induction training and prior to undertaking work in store, each new staff member received further in-store training on store specific procedures, including:

- i. Till operation, in particular the function of the age restricted till prompt.
- ii. Refusal of sale procedures and completion of the store refusals book.
- iii. Procedures in relation to the stores `ready to trade¿ book, which is the stores daily operation manual (in particular, the requirement to log security incidents such as shoplifting).

All staff receive updating training on a retailers responsibilities arising in respect of the sale of alcohol. This is a written test of the staff members knowledge of their responsibilities. It is periodically undertaken (in any event, a minimum of once every six months). The updating training is again fully documented and again all staff members have to siggn to certify that the tests were carried out and properly validated. Any staff member failing the test is subject to further retraining.

12. **Technology**

Upon an age restricted product (e.g. alcohol) being scanned at a checkout, the till immediately identifies that an age restricted product is the subject of the proposed sale and produces appropriate age prompt to the operator. In respect of alcohol, the prompt is 'Is the customer aged over 18'. The till prompt requires the operator to key in 'Y' (for yes) and 'N' (for no) to answer the prompt question. The till will not complete a sale unless and until the operator has pressed the appropriate answer key.

13. A CCTV system is installed in all the Company's stores and will be operated in accordance with the Humberside Police Codes of Practice attached to the application (save that due to the digital nature of the CCTV system copies of recordings can only be kept for 10 days instead of the 28 referred to in the Codes of Practice). The responsible person is the Designated Premise Supervisor.

14. Refusals Log

Each store is required to maintain a refusals log in which refusals of sales of age restricted products (including alcohol) to those suspected of being under age, are logged.

- 15. The refusals log is subject to periodic inspection by store management to ensure that it is being properly maintained by staff members.
- The refusals books is subject to periodic inspection by area managers who are required, upon periodic inspection of a store, to complete a store visit report form confirming (amongst other things) that the refusals log is being maintained by staff members and is being inspected by store management.

17. **Proof of age scheme**

The company stores operate what is known as the 'under 21 rule' whereby there is a standing instruction to staff members that a customer who appears to be below the age of 21 is required to be challenged to produce proof of age, in the form of photo driving licence, passport or the 'Citizen Card'.

18. Signage

All appropriate signage explaining the law relating to the sale of age restricted products (including alcohol) is prominently displayed or near the checkout area in all the Company's stores. Similar signage explaining the Company's 'under 21 rules' is also prominently displayed in the same area.

19. the Licensing Audit

Each store may be subject, on an ad hoc basis, to a periodic licensing audit involving an internal audit by the Area Manager of the application of the Company's due diligence system, in particular that all its elements are being maintained in accordance with the Company standing instructions.

The prevention of crime and disorder

- 20. The Company operates CCTV coverage, as described in the 'General' section above.
- The company employs its own security personnel. Further, where security is a particular issue (for example, where shoplifting is prevalent), the Company has contract supplied security guards to patrol the store.
- 22. The Company operates an 'under 21 rule' proof of age scheme.

Public safety

- 23. The Company undertakes all appropriate Health and Safety and Fire risk assessments.
- 24. All emergency exits are identified by appropriate signage and the Company's Evacuation Policy in the event of fire is set out on signage by emergency exits.

The prevention of public nuisance

- Stores 'ready to trade' book requires store to have an external litter bin available to the public and requires external vicinity of the store to be inspected daily and swept as required. The inspections and required sweeping is required in the relevant section of the daily ready to trade book.
- The Company endeavours to ensure that all deliveries are made between 07:00 hours and 18:00 hours.
- 27. External lighting at the Company stores is limited to the down lighting of fascias, windows and door entrances so as to indicate that the store is open. All such lights are on an automatic timer and switch off 5 minutes after store closing time.

28. Customers who appear to be drunk will not (in accordance with the law) be served alcohol and will not be allowed to remain in the store.

The protection of children from harm

29. The Company does not restrict its range of alcohol products. The Company relies upon its due diligence system to prevent sales of alcohol to children.

I am writing to strongly object to the proposals submitted by Sainsbury's Supermarkets Limited to serve alcohol for an extended period at 2 Ash Road.

I am objecting in my capacity as a ward member for several reasons. Firstly, this is a predominantly residential area with housing opposite, behind, adjacent and I suspect there is some housing directly above the premises. Later operation will have a significant impact on these residents.

We already know the correlation between groups of drunk young people being in an area late at night and the effect this has on the crime figures. It is why we have the Cumulative Impact Policy in central Headingley. Late night refreshment and alcohol would give people a reason to be out and about in this area late at night or early in the morning.

I believe that granting Sainsbury's longer opening hours will go against the licensing objectives and add to disorder in the area; at best through increased noise nuisance and anti social drunken behaviour to at worst disorder and criminal offences.

I am writing on behalf of ARARA (The Ash Road Area Residents' Association) to object to the above application to extend the opening hours of Sainsbury's 2 Ash Road, Headingley, Leeds, LS6 3JF.

We would argue that the provision of late night alcohol sales in the Headingley City Centre cumulative impact policy area constitutes a risk of crime and disorder and public nuisance.

A number of our members live in the immediate vicinity of this shop and we are all subject to footfall by shop customers. If the shop was to remain open for the sale of alcohol after 11 pm it would attract people, probably already drunk, who wished to become more so. There is already a large amount of noise nuisance and litter arising from the high levels of on and off alcohol sales in the area. It has been argued I believe that only those who live very close to the site are entitled to object but I would like to point out that alcohol outlets have an impact on a much wider area than their immediate proximity. The Ash Road area adjoins the Headingley centre but the physical evidence of late night takeaways, discarded bottles and cans, food and vomit can be seen over the whole of our area and the sound of over enthusiastic drinkers is very noticeable.

Disorder from people walking along the streets after 11pm and any time up to 5 o'clock in the morning is also a problem in the whole area. These people, once drunk, have no awareness of the amount of noise they make and the disturbance that this causes to others in this area. The cumulative impact policy was established in recognition of the fact that it is very difficult to pinpoint one pub or one take away food premises as the cause of particular act of nuisance or disorder. As the name suggest the presence of each and every one of them worsens the situation and contributes to a culture where litter, noise and other nuisance is acceptable.

Taking all these factors into consideration ARARA would request that you turn down the application to extend the opening hours of the Sainsbury's store on Ash Road.





I am writing on behalf of the Wood lane Neighbourhood Association to oppose outright the application by Sainsbury's, 2 Ash Road, for variation of a licence for the sale of alcohol every day from 06.00 - 00.00 and for the provision of late night refreshment every day from 23.00 - 00.00.

The application should be refused on the grounds that it contravenes the renewed terms of the Cumulative Impact Policy, agreed by Leeds City Council, related to "the potential impact of a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area" and that the onus lies with the applicant to demonstrate that "the application will not add to the cumulative impact being experienced" in Central Headingley.

Crime and Disorder

There is substantial evidence of the crime and disorder that abounds throughout Headingley as a result of alcohol consumption. The more unpleasant elements are vomiting and urinating in public places and private gardens. The destructive elements include criminal damage to street furniture, signs, window boxes, planters, flower beds and parked cars. The variation of this licence must, inevitably, add to the alcohol-fuelled anti-social behaviour that occurs extremely frequently in Headingley, and especially in the vicinity of North Lane and Bennett Road, in very close proximity to Ash Road.

The latest example of crime and disorder, of which we are aware, was the shifting across the pavement of a very heavy planter that is located on the corner of Cross Chapel Street and North Lane – within 10 metres of the business that wishes to make alcohol readily accessible for 18 hours in every day. There was consequent damage to the planter, which has had to be repaired. Given that the planter probably weighs more than 100 kilograms, this vandalism by a group of able-bodied people was, without question. fuelled by excess alcohol. Nobody in control of their senses would even consider trying to move such a substantial and heavy object. The incident occurred during the weekend of 23/24 October 2010, almost certainly at night because this is a very busy location throughout all daytime hours. It has been recorded by West Yorkshire Police as anti-social behaviour and criminal damage (Crime number 13100469156).

As a previous example of anti-social behaviour and criminal damage, between 14 and 18 February, 2009, two large and heavy planters, located on the pavement in North Lane, were smashed (Pictures are attached). One of them had been moved some yards and rammed against a lamp post. The planters had been in place for only one week (placed on 8 February 2009). The cost for the loss of the planters and contents, to "Headingley in Bloom", was approximately £100.

There is also an on-going need to replace plants in the window boxes at the Community Centre on North Lane, within 50 metres of the Sainsbury's premises. On one occasion, a window box was ripped out and stolen. A replacement for it was bought by "Headingley in Bloom", at a cost of £30 (25 May 2009). More recently (5 July 2010), two window boxes were removed from the ledges on the Bennett Road side of the building. Although damaged, one of these was retrieved from outside "Doveners Funeral Services" in North Lane (see attached photograph). The other window box was mysteriously returned a month after the incident. It is always at night that such vandalism occurs, or plants are removed and sometimes strewn on the pavement. Bottles and glasses are also regularly deposited in the window boxes.

Also, the number of empty bottles and cans that are regularly strewn on the "Rose Garden" make it very clear that there is extensive drinking in this public location, despite this part of North Lane being a "Designated Public Place", with its restriction on drinking alcohol. The Rose Garden is adjacent to the Sainsbury's shop.


These criminal acts cause a "loss of enjoyment" for residents of Headingley and inhibit the improvement of the appearance of the district. The evidence is that when people have been given the opportunity to drink alcohol to excess over extended periods they do not share these values.

Public Nuisance

The sale of refreshment for consumption off the premises already poses an extremely unpleasant burden of litter on the streets of Headingley. It is unacceptable to add significantly to this problem by granting permission for further sales to be made at a time of night when the potential purchasers have had a considerable and extended opportunity to drink sufficient alcohol to suppress any acknowledgement of the law related to the dropping of litter in public places or any latent regard for public decency.







- C. Health and Safety/Legal issues, in particular the sale of products outside sell by dates and the age restricted products;
- d. Company policy and procedures, including staff dress, equal opportunities, hygiene, discipline/grievance and security;
- e. merchandising, including shelf filing and price labeling.
- 9. The Company operates, in respect of all age restricted products, a due dilligence system. In relation to alcohol products, it is designed to ensure that no salesof alcohol occur in breach of the Licensing Laws. This system involves:

10. Staff Training

- a. All staff induction training carried out by a member of the Company's training team. The induction training includes specific training on a retailers legal responsibilities arising in respect of age restricted products.
- b. Insofar as induction training relates to retailers legal responsibilities arising in respect of the sale of alcohol, the induction training involves a written test in which the staff member must obtain a 100% mark to pass.
- c. The induction training is fully documented and the staff member is required to sign to certify that they have received induction training.

11. Staff In-Store training

Subsequent to completion of induction training and prior to undertaking work in store, each new staff member received further in-store training on store specific procedures, including:

- i. Till operation, in particular the function of the age restricted till prompt.
- ii. Refusal of sale procedures and completion of the store refusals book.
- iii. Procedures in relation to the stores `ready to trade¿ book, which is the stores daily operation manual (in particular, the requirement to log security incidents such as shoplifting).

All staff receive updating training on a retailers responsibilities arising in respect of the sale of alcohol. This is a written test of the staff members knowledge of their responsibilities. It is periodically undertaken (in any event, a minimum of once every six months). The updating training is again fully documented and again all staff members have to si9gn to certify that the tests were carried out and properly validated. Any staff member failing the test is subject to further retraining.

12. **Technology**

Upon an age restricted product (e.g. alcohol) being scanned at a checkout, the till immediately identifies that an age restricted product is the subject of the proposed sale and produces appropriate age prompt to the operator. In respect of alcohol, the prompt is 'Is the customer aged over 18'. The till prompt requires the operator to key in 'Y' (for yes) and 'N' (for no) to answer the prompt question. The till will not complete a sale unless and until the operator has pressed the appropriate answer key.

13. A CCTV system is installed in all the Company's stores and will be operated in accordance with the Humberside Police Codes of Practice attached to the application (save that due to the digital nature of the CCTV system copies of recordings can only be kept for 10 days instead of the 28 referred to in the Codes of Practice). The responsible person is the Designated Premise Supervisor.

14. Refusals Log

Each store is required to maintain a refusals log in which refusals of sales of age restricted products (including alcohol) to those suspected of being under age, are logged.

- 15. The refusals log is subject to periodic inspection by store management to ensure that it is being properly maintained by staff members.
- The refusals books is subject to periodic inspection by area managers who are required, upon periodic inspection of a store, to complete a store visit report form confirming (amongst other things) that the refusals log is being maintained by staff members and is being inspected by store management.

17. **Proof of age scheme**

The company stores operate what is known as the 'under 21 rule' whereby there is a standing instruction to staff members that a customer who appears to be below the age of 21 is required to be challenged to produce proof of age, in the form of photo driving licence, passport or the 'Citizen Card'.

18. Signage

All appropriate signage explaining the law relating to the sale of age restricted products (including alcohol) is prominently displayed or near the checkout area in all the Company's stores. Similar signage explaining the Company's 'under 21 rules' is also prominently displayed in the same area.

19. the Licensing Audit

Each store may be subject, on an ad hoc basis, to a periodic licensing audit involving an internal audit by the Area Manager of the application of the Company's due diligence system, in particular that all its elements are being maintained in accordance with the Company standing instructions.

The prevention of crime and disorder

- 20. The Company operates CCTV coverage, as described in the 'General' section above.
- The company employs its own security personnel. Further, where security is a particular issue (for example, where shoplifting is prevalent), the Company has contract supplied security guards to patrol the store.
- 22. The Company operates an 'under 21 rule' proof of age scheme.

Public safety

- 23. The Company undertakes all appropriate Health and Safety and Fire risk assessments.
- 24. All emergency exits are identified by appropriate signage and the Company's Evacuation Policy in the event of fire is set out on signage by emergency exits.

The prevention of public nuisance

- Stores 'ready to trade' book requires store to have an external litter bin available to the public and requires external vicinity of the store to be inspected daily and swept as required. The inspections and required sweeping is required in the relevant section of the daily ready to trade book.
- 26. The Company endeavours to ensure that all deliveries are made between 07:00 hours and 18:00 hours.
- 27. External lighting at the Company stores is limited to the down lighting of fascias, windows and door entrances so as to indicate that the store is open. All such lights are on an automatic timer and switch off 5 minutes after store closing time.

28. Customers who appear to be drunk will not (in accordance with the law) be served alcohol and will not be allowed to remain in the store.

The protection of children from harm

29. The Company does not restrict its range of alcohol products. The Company relies upon its due diligence system to prevent sales of alcohol to children.
