## Information about your permit to use Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre



## Leeds City Council residents in your area can now recycle and dispose of waste at Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre (HWRC).

### Your new permit

Please find enclosed your new permit to use at Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre. We have produced a permit that will stick to your vehicle windscreen, to make it convenient for you.



### General conditions of use

- The permit remains the property of Leeds City Council.
- Only people who live in your household can use the permit.
- You will be required to show your permit to the attendant on arrival at the site. Ideally, place the permit in your car windscreen, as this makes it more convenient for both you and the site attendant. However, if this is not practicable then please be ready to show it.
- The permit is for household waste only and can only be used in a domestic car.
- Misuse of the permit will result in its withdrawal.
- Only one permit will be issued per address.

### Please recycle

Wakefield Council and Leeds City Council aim to recycle as much as possible of all household waste brought to the centre. Please separate your rubbish before you visit the centre to make it easier to recycle.

### What can I recycle?

The following items can be recycled at Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre:

Cans/aerosols	Brick & rubble	Electronic equipment
Paper	Garden green waste	Computers
Cardboard	White goods e.g fridges	Light tubes
Plastics bottles	Mineral oils	TV's, videos
Glass bottles/jars	Lead acid batteries	Scrap metal
Textiles	Timber	Tyres
Shoes	Gas cylinders	

### What if my only vehicle is a van or pick up?

The Castleford centre does not accept commercial waste or household waste from commercial vehicles. Vans or pick-ups will not be allowed to deposit waste at the site. This includes the use of hire vans.

For Leeds City Council residents, if your sole means of transport is a van or pick-up you may dispose of your household waste at recycling centres at East Leeds, Stanley Road and Holmewell Road on Wednesdays and Saturdays only.

### Use of trailers

The use of trailers at the Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre is allowed, provided the trailer does not exceed 6' x 4'. All waste brought to the site will be monitored to ensure it is not from business or commercial venture. If the waste is deemed as commercial, for example builders or shop waste, the permit may be withdrawn.

### What if I am carrying out DIY work on my own property?

The Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre will accept this material in small quantities.

### Brick, rubble and soil

Brick, rubble and soil will be accepted at the Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre but it is limited to one 6' x 4' trailer load or, six 25 kilogram size bags of this material per week. If you are carrying out work that is likely to exceed this limit, for example, digging out foundations or removing a drive, you should obtain a skip from a local contractor.

### Cement bonded asbestos

Cement bonded asbestos **cannot** be disposed of at the Castleford Household Waste Recycling Centre. Leeds City Council residents can dispose of small quantities of cement bonded asbestos at Kirkstall Road Household Waste Sorting Site. For further advice contact Leeds City Council.
