Dear Sir/Madam

We are writing in response to the recent licence application for Late Night Refreshment at the address above.

We wish to oppose the application as it stands as we believe it creates an unwanted precedent in the centre of Chapel Allerton. In our view the opening hours for Friday and Saturday in particular are too late, bearing in mind that the relatively small commercial area on Stainbeck Lane is surrounded by predominantly residential properties, and the risk of resulting noise disturbance from customers, vehicles, taxis etc is too great. We have examined the opening hours of other potential competitors to Jaldi Jaldi in Chapel Allerton, and none are as late as 3.00 AM. We feel that the granting of this licence would cause an escalation and applications from everyone else to follow suit. The Cumulative Impact policy certainly has great relevance here.

It springs to mind that the only activity to keep people in Chapel Allerton until the early hours would be patronising the many bars in the area. It is a fact that people become more careless under these circumstances - we do not want the inevitable trail of discarded cans, bottles, crisp packets and plastic food trays found up Allerton Hill first thing every Sunday Morning to grow any larger.

For these reasons we would like to see the opening hours to be extended only to 11.30 PM Sun -Thurs, which would match their nearest competitor, with perhaps 12.00 AM for Friday and Saturday.
