Summary of main issues

This is an application to vary a premises licence held by Nisa Malvern Beeston Road, Beeston, Leeds, LS11 8ND

Responsible authorities and Ward Members have been notified of this application.

The Premises was previously known as The Malvern and operated as a public house with the facility to provide alcohol for consumption both off and on the premise. The licence also provided the facilities for entertainment and late night refreshment.

This application has been received in order to vary the licence to remove the facilities of entertainment, late night refreshment and to vary the supply of alcohol for consumption off the premise only. All conditions in relation to the removed activities, have been requested to also be removed and replaced with those offered at section P of the application.

It is the applicants intention to open the premise from 07:30 for the sale of alcohol. The Premise is currently licensed from 10:00 for all licensable activities Monday to Saturday and 12:00 on Sunday.

The variation application has attracted representation from Councillor's and the Environmental Protection team, recognised as a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003.

1.0 Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") for a premises licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt of representations.

2.0 History of Premises

The Premise currently benefits from a Premise Licence granted under the Licensing Act 2003. The application to convert and vary was granted at the Licensing sub committee on 30th September 2005. The application did attract representations which were subsequently agreed and the application was granted as applied for with the addition of certain conditions.

From the date of Grant to the present time a number of applications have been received to vary the Designated Premise Supervisor or Transfer the Licence, all of which where successful and no representations were received.

A Transfer and Designated Premise Supervisor application was received on 7th December 2011 which was granted with immediate effect as no representations were received. Therefore, the premise is now under new management, hence the need to vary the original licence.

An objection has been received from the Environmental Protection Team to which no agreement has been reached. Members attention is drawn to Appendix **D**

7.3 <u>Representations from Interested parties</u>

7.3.1 The application has attrracted representations from interested parties.

The Licensing Section is in receipt of two objections received from local Councillor's both with regards to the opening hours of the premises which may lead to Public Nuisance to local residents. Members attention is drawn to Appendix **E**.

8.0 Options Available to Members

8.1 The Licensing sub-committee must take such of the following steps as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

- Grant the variation as requested.
- Grant the variation whilst imposing additional conditions and/or altering in any way the proposed operating schedule.
- Exclude any licensable activities to which the application relates.
- Reject the whole or part of the application.
- 8.2 Members of the licensing sub committee are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject the whole or part of the application merely because it considers it desirable to do so. It must actually be necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives.
